BASIC FIRST AID CLASS

What would you do if a person:

- Is Choking
- Has Chest Pain
- Has Severe Bleeding
- Is Unconscious

Basic first aid refers to the initial process of assessing and addressing the needs of someone who has been injured or is in physiological distress due to choking, a heart attack, allergic reactions, drugs or other medical emergencies. Basic first aid allows you to quickly determine a person's physical condition and the correct course of treatment. You should always seek professional medical help as soon as you are able, but following correct first aid procedures can be the difference between life and death.

ADDING SHADE & STORAGE SHEDS

From the Architectural Committee

This summer has been extra hot, and a good way to escape the heat is by putting up a *patio cover/awning* over your patio. Also, some folks are putting in *sheds for storage*. So, we'd like to share some information that will help you in designing these structures.

Do remember that **the Town of Prescott Valley** will only allow you to *cover up to 50% of your lot*. This means that you figure the square footage of your lot (length X width), divide that figure in half, and you will know how much coverage all of your buildings may cover. Then, measure the "footprint" of your existing buildings (house, shed, carport, awnings, etc.) and total them up. *If the total is less than half of your lot size*, then you have some room to construct a patio cover or shed. If you have questions please feel free to call anyone on the Architectural Committee. Check your CC&Rs and Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations for specifics on size, and detail roof coverage. See CC&Rs, Sec.3.5.2, p.9 for sheds; A-C Committee Rules & Regulations, p.9 for lot coverage.

"Lot coverage" means any solid roof structure. As an option, if you already have too much coverage, there are "Shade Screens" that shade about 90% of the sun, and can be stretched over a frame to cover a patio, and *they do not count* as "roof coverage." There is one in our Villages now.

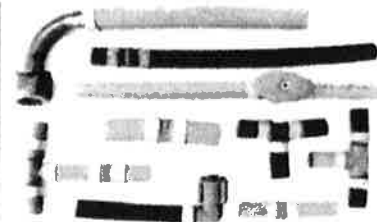

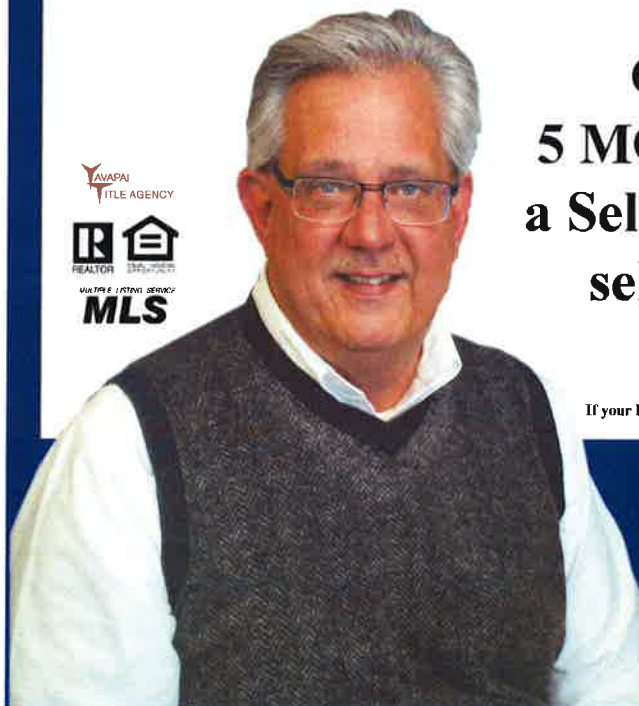
