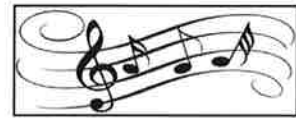

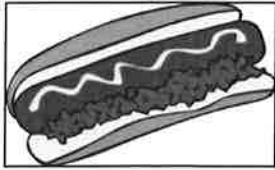

BLOCK WATCH

“Creating Safer Neighborhoods One Block at a Time”

It seems there is never an end to the type of scams disreputable people will invent to steal your money. Here are two more to be watchful for:

Federal Grant Scam - Phone calls are made by someone indicating they are a federal government employee. They will offer you a federal grant of a few thousand dollars due to your good credit history. To collect this you will be instructed to obtain a \$200 iTunes card from a nearby convenience store, provide the card number and then expect a transfer of the grant amount stated. This is not how federal grants are obtained. You are required to ask for a grant for a specific purpose in writing.

Car Payment Scam – You will receive a phone call indicating you are several months behind in your car payments and you must make a payment immediately or your car will be impounded. Hopefully you will all know whether or not you are behind in any of your financial obligations.

Before you send any money to anyone for any unclear reasons please call the specific institution or the Prescott Valley PD to verify the authenticity of the caller.

What About Privacy Screens & Fences?

Well, Thanksgiving is just over and now we are all preparing for Christmas or Hanukkah, so serious thoughts about landscaping and improving our lots may be minimal at this time. Yet, some of you may be considering installing a fence or a privacy screen soon. So the following information might be helpful for you.

1. Fences: Did you ever wonder why our **fences** cannot be taller than 3-feet? Our CC&Rs' state that only three feet is the maximum height allowed. This ruling is based on the Town of Prescott Valley's regulations, which is that close-together communities (such as ours) are limited to fences that are no higher than 3 feet. This assists fire personnel and police who may need to get over fences to protect us from fire or bad people. Since our homes are close together, the fire department wants to quickly attack a fire while also preventing the fire from spreading to nearby homes.
2. Sometimes fences are thought of as **privacy screens** because the height of a **six foot** fence helps it to serve also as a privacy screen. However, a three-foot fence will never serve as a privacy screen. Now, privacy screens are 5 or 6 feet tall and are used exclusively here for privacy purposes. Therefore, a fence is usually used on the perimeter of a lot within allowable set-backs; privacy screens, on the other hand, are usually built to provide privacy from neighboring lots, either around the perimeter of a patio or in front of a window (but not on the property line). **However**, according to the rules, a privacy screen must *not block the panoramic view of any of the neighbors*.
3. The **accepted materials** that may be used for fences and privacy screens are listed in the "Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations" and the CC&R's, Section 3.

If you have questions, please feel free to contact any member of the Architectural Committee. We will be happy to work with you to achieve your goal.

ALSO, the Architectural Committee members trust you all had a **Happy Thanksgiving, and wish a Merry Christmas and a Happy Hanukkah** to all of our residents and staff at the Villages at Lynx Creek!

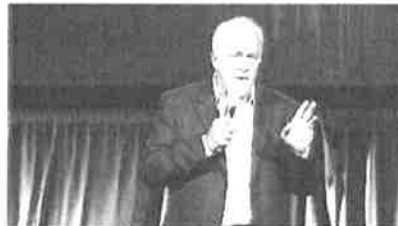

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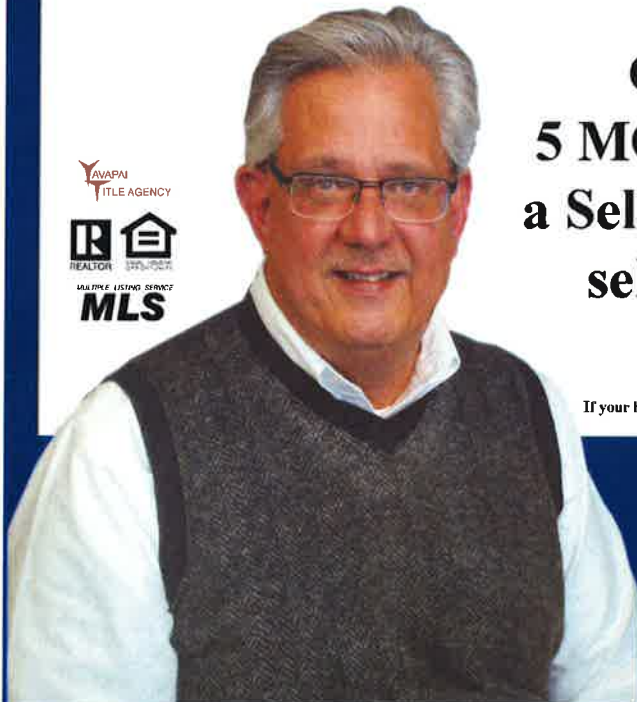
