THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CRIMINAL ISSUES AND COMMUNITY ISSUES AND WHO YOU SHOULD CALL

For all residents of the Villages, particularly those who are new to our community, although we have a Dewey mailing address and zip code, the Villages is in the City of Prescott Valley (P.V.) and the P.V. Police Department takes care of any "criminal/crime" issues.

Block Watch participation is being aware of your 'neighborhood'...your neighbors, cars, homes, property... it is noticing when something does "not look right."

If you witness <u>criminal activity</u>, immediately dial 911 and report it.

If you witness <u>suspicious activity</u>, immediately call the police non-emergency phone 928-772-9267 to report it. Put these numbers on your phone's Speed Dial.

Please <u>DO NOT call</u> the Villages' contact phone numbers, or the Block Watch Liaison, as that would cause delay in getting any official response.

Please <u>DO call</u> the Villages' contact numbers listed in the box below if you observe "non-crime" issues such as water leaks, open windows, lights out, etc in the <u>Villages' common areas</u>. (streets, courtyard, social hall and other rooms in the complex, tennis courts, etc.) For these you may call the Office during work hours, or after-hours call the FSR Management number to leave a message, or the Villages' Monitor on Duty or a Board Member to make a report. These issues are handled by Villages' personnel; they do not take care of "crime" issues.



THINK AHEAD

Important Information for Your Lot Improvements

Hi folks. As you probably have guessed by now, the purpose of the Architectural Committee (A-C) is to assist you, as lot owners, in improving your lots and the *outside* of your homes. Whenever folks buy into an HOA community they sign a contract to obey the rules of the community which are contained in the *CC&Rs* and the *"Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations"*.

Sometimes people get aggravated over having to submit a "Request For Change" (these forms are at the front office) and to wait for approval. As aggravating as it may seem, it is in the rules, which we all agreed to, that this must be done. In general, this means that any of your outside improvements must be approved by the A-C BEFORE work is started (emergency situations are handled differently). It may take 1 to 3 weeks to get an approval from the A-C. Since most people plan their projects ahead of time, and arrange for contractors ahead of time, it makes sense that then is the time to submit your Request for Change – not after a contractor is scheduled or you have started the project. This includes replacing shingles on roofs, and installing antennas.

Also, the <u>Town of Prescott Valley</u> now requires a City Permit on most construction over 4 feet tall. It is the lot owner's responsibility to obtain any needed permits. **The A-C needs to see** evidence of a permit BEFORE granting permission on construction projects – including replacing roof shingles.

The A-C is committed to making sure that our homes remain safe and to keeping our community beautiful and enjoyable to live in.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING R.V. REFRIGERATORS

Last month, there was a fire in an R.V. here in the Villages, caused by a faulty refrigerator.

There are 2 companies who have issued a recall on their RV refrigerators, due to fire danger. The two companies who make/sell the reefers on recall are 1) Norcold and, 2) Dometic. The Norcold website said that 3-5 units burn up per week! So the following information is very important.

It is important that <u>everyone</u> who owns an **RV with a refrigerator** needs to see if it is made by Norcold or Dometic. If so, they need to do the following:

- 1) Write down the Serial Number of their unit.
- 2) Go on-line to that company's website (norco.com or dometic.com)
- 3) Follow the directions as follows:
- a) Norco Go to :"<u>norcold.com</u>", then go to "View More of Our Products", then scroll down to "Recall Information". You will find the information you need.
- b) Dometic Go to "<u>dometic.com</u>", click on "*United States*", then *type in "Recall*", then go to "*Dometic Recall*." Follow the directions.

There are also phone numbers given that one can call to make inquiries. Or, they can Google their refrigerator company's name, and follow that trail.
