

"Creating Safer Neighborhoods One Block at a Time"

Thank you to all who stopped by the Safety and Security Awareness Event, Saturday, July 23, 2016. Feedback from all of the responders was positive and all agreed it was a rousing success. I was asked if this will be an annual event here at the Villages and, of course I replied 'yes', and hope you all agree.

I truly hope that you all came away with a better understanding of the importance of Block Watch and Emergency Preparedness programs and I am looking for those who will assist in the development, support and growth of such at the Villages. The time and physical requirements are minimal but the benefits immeasurable.

May I remind you of the escalating criminal issues to which we have recently been subjected? These incidents occur when the 'bad guys' know we are not aware of our surroundings and do not know who does or does not belong and what to do when we are concerned.

I would like to start by inviting you to a meeting to discuss what and how we can 'CREATE A SAFER NEIGHBORHOOD, ONE BLOCK AT A TIME.'

NOTES FROM YOUR BOARD OF DIRECTORS

REMINDERS TO ALL RESIDENTS

- If you are going to be away from the Villages during Winter months, please remember to winterize your water pipes and/or drip systems as we do experience freezing temperatures which could cause damage. If you have questions on this, please contact the Villages Office.
- If you are a "seasonal" resident, please notify the Villages Office if you have a "seasonal" change of mailing address or phone number.
- If you rent your property, your Renter must register with the Villages Office, provide age certification and register any pets. Please inform your Renter of the Association rules or have them request copies at the Office. Renters have the same responsibility as Owners to follow the Association rules.
- Golf Cart Rules per Villages Rules & Regulations #22.: "All carts must obey the speed limit. Hand signals are required for indicating turns and stopping. All Cart operators must be 16 year of age or older or be accompanied by a licensed adult resident who shall be responsible for their actions."
- For residents who walk during dusk or dark hours, it is suggested you wear a reflective garment or reflective taping on your clothes to enable drivers to see you on the roadway.
- Recreational Vehicles (RV's) placed on Villages RV lots cannot be more than 15 years old. This applies to a Renter's RV as well as a property owner's personal RV.
- Residents are expected to follow the pet rules for the Villages, which are outlined in the CC&R's 3.5.7, pages 9 & 10: Animals must be under direct control of the owner (or Lessee) when on the Lot and on a leash when off the Owner's Lot. No animals may be kept on Lots which result in an annoyance or a nuisance to residents in the vicinity. (please refer to additional rules in Section 3.5.7) The Villages is in the City of Prescott Valley and the City Animal Control Laws apply to our Community. Complaints of barking dogs, other animal nuisance or a dangerous animal should be reported, by the complainant, to the Prescott Valley Animal Control Unit at 928-772-5154.

REMINDER - VILLAGES RULES & REGULATIONS REGARDING SOCIAL HALL EVENTS

All Villages residents have equal rights to attend and participate in any events in the Social Hall. To assure these rights, other residents may not attempt to reserve a particular table or seating arrangement in advance of the activity. However, in the interest of allowing persons coming from other sections of the Villages to sit together with their friends, it will be permissible for at least two (2) persons to occupy and reserve an entire table commencing not earlier than one hour before the scheduled commencement of the event, or for later than 15 minutes before the scheduled start. At that time, it becomes open seating. Please comply with this rule to save yourselves and other residents any embarrassment.

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

"Yeah, but ... THEY did it!"

Hi folks, while there are many homeowners fixing up and beautifying their homes, every once in a while there is someone who wants to make a change to their lot similar to the way someone down the street did theirs. And, that's great! It's a good thing to share ideas of home improvement. However, *sometimes* the Architectural Committee must deny such a request for change, because what they want to do is not according to the CC&Rs or the Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations.

Then we hear the proverbial, "Yeah, but, the guy up the street did it!" The problem is that sometimes people don't look at the rules before they plan. The reality is that it is likely that the "guy up the street" is out of compliance. What he built was probably done before there were HOA rules, when the developer was selling the lots, and is "Grandfathered". If he changes that situation, he will lose the "Grandfather" status and that situation will need to be brought in line with our Rules. It is also possible (but unlikely) that the "guy up the street" did what he did without HOA approval.

But, here is the "Bottom Line" – If the project you want to do on your lot or outside of your home does not comply with the HOA rules (in the <u>CC&R</u>s and the <u>Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations</u>), then the Architectural Committee cannot approve that project. Period. For example, several requests have come to us to add a deck inside a carport. If the deck does not interfere with the parking of a vehicle, it may be approved. The minimum size of most manufactured carports is 12'x20'. You need to be able to park a medium-sized car in a carport. If you build a deck so that a car cannot be parked under the carport, then you no longer have a carport, but a covered deck. Our rules state that you must have a carport.

Please, for your ease of heart, plan ahead, read the HOA rules, and submit the "**Request For Change**" to the office well in advance of doing the project — let us help you to make sure that your project is in compliance with the HOA rules.

As a reminder: **When your project is finished**, *please fill out the back of your* **Yellow Permit** (that you put in your window) and turn it in to the office. We will file it in your lot file, and send a copy to you for your records. This will establish that you legitimately completed your project.


