

BLOCK WATCH "CREATING SAFER NEIGHBORHOODS ONE BLOCK AT A TIME"

NEW AND POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS TWIST ON AN OLD SCAM

Scammers have taken their evil ways to a new low. The initial scam involves calls demanding the purchase and sending of iTune cards or risk having your computer infected with a virus.

However, the new twist is if you answer and refuse, they become angry. They then resort to calling a local law enforcement agency identifying themselves as the homeowner and report that 3 or 4 subjects with bats and wearing ski masks are trying to break into your home. The caller continues to give updates while supposedly locked in the bathroom. At some point they indicate the suspects have entered the home. Dispatchers could hear banging on the walls towards the end of the call.

Officers are dispatched and you can imagine being woken in the wee hours of the morning and your home surrounded by law enforcement. Unfortunately, you are treated as a suspect until they verify who you are. This actually occurred in Wilhoit where YCSO deputies responded and while they were there, the scam suspect called again. They recognized the heavy accent as the same as the original caller.

This situation represents a danger to both victims and law enforcement personnel who are responding in a high risk manner

WHEN YOU RECEIVE CALLS FROM SCAMMERS, SIMPLY HANG UP. IF CALLS CONTINUE, BLOCK THE NUMBER. DO NOT ANSWER CALLS FROM "UNKNOWN" SOURCES OR NAMES AND NUMBER YOU DO NOT RECOGNIZE. IF THE CALL IS LEGITIMATE, THEY WILL LEAVE A MESSAGE.

A-C* NEWS FOR YOU: "When Do I Need An RFC?"

Spring is here! It's that time when we plan home improvement projects. Don't forget to submit your plans to the *Architectural Committee IN ADVANCE of work to be done. You do this by submitting a "Request For Change" (RFC). When the project is finished, sign and turn in your Yellow Permit to the office.

What kind of projects requires an RFC from the Architectural Committee (A-C)? First, the basic rule of thumb is this: *Any change to the outside of your house or to the lot requires an RFC.* These changes would include, but not be limited to, the following examples:

- 1. All Antennas and Satellite Dishes including TV and Ham radio antennas.
- 2. Awnings, Decks, and Gazebos
- 3. Doors and windows changed or replaced.
- 4. All Cement work (including driveways, sidewalks, etc.)
- 5. Exterior Air Conditioning units of all types.
- 6. Entrance Lighting along sidewalks, and on the building.
- 7. Painting and Decorations on the exterior of your buildings.
- 8. Fences front and back.
- 9. Greenhouses
- 10. Bar-B-Q grills of the permanent structure type.
- 11. Rain Barrels
- 12. Recreation and Exercise Equipment for outside use.
- 13. Security Devices on the outside the home.
- 14. Sidewalks including pavers
- 15. Vegetable Gardens fencing, the raised kind, etc.

These are *just a few* of the *types* of projects for which the A-C needs the "*Request For Change*". Please also confer with your *CC&R's* in Section 3; and the "*Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations*" packet. You may also ask any of the A-C members.

ATTENTION: PET OWNERS

The Arizona Department of Agriculture is warning pet owners about the deadly bacteria: Leptospirosis.

It's spread through bodily fluids like urine and humans can catch the bacteria, too. Normally the Valley sees about four cases a year. At this point, there are more than 40 confirmed cases in dogs.

The bacteria can live for months in wet soil, which is why the Valley normally doesn't see many cases with its dry conditions. Health officials aren't pinpointing where the infections started in the Valley, but they are warning pet owners to be cautious with doggy daycare and dog parks.

Pets will usually show symptoms when they are sick with the bacteria. Veterinarians say dogs will be tired, probably won't eat and drink a lot of water. The disease is treated by antibiotics but could be deadly if left untreated. Scottsdale is the hardest hit city with other cases in Phoenix, Gilbert, Tempe, Litchfield Park, Fountain Hills and Avondale.




