IMPORTANT - RESERVING FACILITIES FOR CLUB AND GROUP ACTIVITIES

It is time to start thinking about reservations for 2018 in the social hall, activities room, card room and swimming pool. The reservation requests are available in the Activity Room. The request (s) must be turned in by October 4th (Wednesday) and will be reviewed by the Recreation Committee on Wednesday, October 11th at the 10:00 am meeting in the Card Room. NOTES FROM YOUR COMMUNITY MANAGER

- For those using the pool, please towel-dry and put on footwear before walking into the Social Hall, in order to prevent slipping on wet floors.
- All the vacant properties in front of our community are <u>privately-owned</u>. They are not owned by the Villages. Anyone parking or selling vehicles on those properties is trespassing and is subject to having their vehicle ticketed by the Prescott Valley P.D. and/or towed (at the request of the property owner.)
- Please be aware there are high numbers of wasps in our area; check your property for possible wasp nests. There has been an increase in snake sightings; be cautious when walking at night (carry a stick to make noise prior to stepping.) Please do not prop open the community building doors, to prevent snakes, lizards, bees, and wasps from entering the rooms.
- For residents who walk during dusk or dark hours, it is suggested you wear a reflective garment or reflective taping on your clothes to enable drivers to see you on the roadway.
- Reminder: We are in high-fire danger months and much of our Community is surrounded by wild-land brush. Please do not discard any coals or wood from BBQ's or fireplaces, etc. in any outside area. Soak such materials in water until completely extinguished and then discard in the compactor.
- Reminder: Children's Pool Hours: These are posted on the entry gate as well as inside the common area. Hours are 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM and 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM. The Village Owner or Resident MUST be present at the pool, at all times, with their visiting children. Only family members or guests staying with an Owner or Resident may use the pool. Name badges for non-residents must be obtained from the Office and carried or worn at all times by a non-resident while in the common areas.
- Reminder: Golf Cart Rules per Villages Rules & Regulations #22. "All carts must obey the speed limit. Hand signals are required for indicating turns and stopping. All Cart operators must be 16 year of age or older or be accompanied by a licensed adult resident who shall be responsible for their actions."

Getting Started to Beautify & Improve Your Home

From the Architectural Committee

There are so many folks beautifying their properties! It is absolutely wonderful. As you plan any changes to the <u>outside</u> of your home or lot, please remember to read the *CC&Rs* and the "Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations", then <u>submit your plans in the HOA-required</u> "Request For Change" (RFC), to the <u>Architectural Committee (A-C), at the front office.</u> This <u>must be submitted BEFORE YOU START</u> the actual work on your project. This includes painting and major repairs. You may pick up an RFC at the Villages' office, and turn it in there when the RFC is filled out. The A-C will go over it with you on the next meeting-day after you turn in the RFC.

Please Note: IT VERY IMPORTANT THAT YOU or your representative ATTEND THE MEETING to discuss your plans with us, <u>and to receive your HOA Permit</u>. The Architectural Committee <u>meets</u> every 1st and 3rd Wednesday at 9 a.m., in the Card Room. Everyone is welcome – our meetings are open. If you have questions or just want to observe how the A-C works, you are welcome.

Also Note: If you are planning on **building a Car Port**, the new regulation for the size is now <u>12'x24'</u>. There was a recent misprint stating 10' - *this is wrong*. The Board approved 12'x24'.




