

It is permissible for at least two (2) persons to occupy and reserve an entire table commencing not earlier than one hour before the scheduled start of the event, or not later than 15 minutes before the scheduled start. At that time, it becomes open seating.

BLOCK WATCH



"Creating Safer Neighborhoods One Block at a Time"

The Goodwin Fire, in June, may have awakened the Villages to the fact most residents were not prepared for an emergency. Although that particular incident was not a real threat to us, we don't know when the next fire or disaster could affect us.

This unpredictability is why we must **make a plan, build a kit, be informed and inspire others.** Even though you may never need to evacuate or shelter in place, being prepared will at least bring you peace of mind...just in case.

Make a Plan – Preparedness starts with a plan that describes where you and/or your family will go and how you will communicate in an emergency.

Build a kit – An emergency should contain enough supplies to support you for 72 hours and should include your communication plan, non-perishable food, water and medications; Go-Kits for immediate evacuation

Be informed – The more you know about local hazards, emergency plans, current events, local news and weather and government information sources, the more you'll be ready to respond.

Inspire others – Be a positive example of preparedness and look to include others in your preparations.

Emergency preparedness for the whole community is not what you can do alone, but what we can do **together.**

Can My Fence Serve As A Privacy Screen?

From the Architectural Committee

Sometimes, the Architectural Committee members are asked why we won't permit a **fence** that is taller than 4-feet. This is the CC&Rs' ruling, and probably has something to do with community safety. Ours is a close-together community and as such is prone to certain dangers. So, for our fire and police protection it is relatively easy for them to hop over 4-foot fences, if need be, to prevent a fire from spreading to neighboring homes.

Privacy Screens, however, are a different matter in size. These can be up to 6-feet tall. What is the difference between a Privacy Screen and a fence? The answer is: "Location, location, location." While **a fence** can be attached to the house, and is basically around the perimeter or partial perimeter of your lot and set back 6 inches from the property lines. The **Privacy Screens**, on the other hand, are usually built around the edge of a patio or in front of your window to provide privacy from neighboring lots. For example, one man built a patio that wound up only a few feet from his neighbor's patio, so they both built a Privacy Screen around their patios to block the view from the neighboring patio. **However**, they had to make sure that the Privacy Screen *did not block the panoramic view of any of their neighbors*.

Therefore, the answer to the question in our title is, no. This is because Privacy Screens and Fences are not the same in our CC&Rs.

The **accepted materials** that may be used for fences and Privacy Screens are listed in your copy of the "Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations."

If you have questions, please feel free to contact any member of the Architectural Committee. Our phone numbers are on the "Request For Change" form. We will be happy to work with you to achieve your goal.




