NOTES FROM YOUR BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Our Villages' streets are narrow and used by pedestrians. We have no sidewalks (except on the entrance road). The streets are our sidewalks. Before backing out of your driveways, please be vigilant and look to your left, right and behind your vehicle.

The right-of-way rule is: Pedestrians are 1st; golf carts, wheelchairs, bicycles are 2nd and vehicles are 3rd. Please be careful and avoid possible injuries or accidents. Pedestrians are also expected to be vigilant when walking on the streets. Watch for vehicles and wear reflective clothing during dark hours. Please be aware and be safe.

FROM THE VILLAGES' COMMUNITY MANAGER

Monitors New Duties and Responsibilities:

Effective January 1, 2017, the monitors will only be working 10 hours a week so we have changed their responsibilities and duties. This is the direction we will be going in for the New Year. Monitor/s shall be directly responsible for the locking and unlocking of the common area facilities and to monitor the activities therein to ascertain any obvious violations of the CC&R's or other governing documents. The specific job duties involve:

Unlock the facilities at 6:00 AM from May 1st to October 31st and 7:00 AM from November 1st through April 31st. (Saturday, Sunday and Holidays only). Maintenance will responsible for opening up the facilities Monday through Friday mornings.

Lock the facilities at 10:00 PM year-round. Sunday through Saturday including Holidays). Their responsibility within the facilities is to check to see that all exterior lights, including the pool, are working (all interior lights should be off) and report any to the contrary on a work order. Including other specific duties assigned with the facility per management.

During morning and evening rounds, and at other times when they are in the building vicinity, the monitors will be alert for any unauthorized persons using the facilities or anyone using them improperly. This also includes vehicles parked improperly without permits in the common areas. Reasonable efforts should be taken to correct the situation but if the persons object seriously, a decision should be made as to whether the violation is serious enough to call for law enforcement or to report it to Management for action.

BLOCK WATCH "CREATING SAFER NEIGHBORHOODS ONE BLOCK AT A TIME"

Recently two, possibly Hispanic males, were seen driving slowly through the Villages. When a resident questioned their purpose for being here they replied they were looking to purchase vehicles. I seriously doubt that was their intent.

Block Watch is simply knowing your neighborhood well enough to recognize suspicious persons or activities and then to call the Prescott valley PD (PVPD) immediately when you do at 928-772-9261 or 911 if you feel it is emergency situation.

Do not approach them as was done above. **Do not** call board members, monitors or neighbors as that delays the response of the PVPD and involves third party information which is usually not accurate. No one residing at the Villages has the skills and strength necessary to protect themselves should the person decide to get physical.

Do commit as much to memory as possible such as personal or vehicle description and license plate info. Taking a picture with a cell phone or other similar device is encouraged as well. Then call PVPD ASAP to pass on the information while it is still fresh in your mind.

A-C NEWS FOR YOU -It's A Wonderful New Year!

Happy New Year! Did you make any New Year's Resolutions? If so, no doubt some of you will be "resolving" to improve your homes. Well, just as a reminder, if you improve the outside of your home or your lot, you will need to submit a "*Request For Change*" (aka, an RFC) which you may pick up at the Villages Office.

Also, please be advised that if you do any kind of outside construction that is higher than 4 feet, you'll need to check with the **Town of Prescott Valley for a building permit**. This includes all sheds as well.

You will need an RFC for removing and planting bushes and trees, placing pavers, sidewalks, and decorative rocks/gravel. Also for major repairs and *painting* the outside of your house – even if you are *re-painting* the same color, the rules state that you must submit an RFC.

An exception is, that if you plant flowers or small shrubs that are <u>less than 3 feet in height</u>, you do NOT need an RFC .

If you want to construct a shed or deck *under your carport*, you must leave ample room for an average size car to park under the carport, or your request will be denied because then it is no longer a carport, which according to the CC&R's you must have.

For further information, please check your *CC&R's Section 3*, and your copy of the *Architectural Committee Rules &Regulations* BEFORE you fill out the Request For Change. Your RFC must be approved BEFORE you start your project.


