The Committee is continuously planning scheduled events as well as searching for new fun activities. Share ideas that you may have experienced at other parks where you have lived. We are always interested in new and/or different ideas. If you have an activity you would like the Committee to consider, please come to a meeting to tell us your idea or take a printed copy to the office.

The monthly meetings are on the 2nd Wednesday at 10:00 am in the Card Room.

Come see what we are about. If you are a new resident, we would love to meet you. All owners and renters are encouraged to attend our meetings and we welcome your participation.



Who's a volunteer?

Someone who chooses to act in recognition of a need, with an attitude of social responsibility that benefits the "community" without concern for monetary profit.

Not everything that's voluntary is volunteering. A few examples:

You can *join* a club, an association, a recreational sports team, etc. Being a member is not, in and of itself, volunteering, although it is voluntary. However, if you become an officer, chair a committee, or give time to a project, you *do* become a "volunteer".

NOTES FROM YOUR COMMUNITY MANAGER

An OPEN DUMPSTER will be placed in the parking area in front of the Maintenance Yard on May 30th for residents 'use until filled. This is for all miscellaneous items other than daily garbage. Do not put garbage in this dumpster.

Residents need to remove all personal pool equipment from the bathrooms. (this includes noodles, weights, etc.) Personal items may no longer be stored in the bathrooms.

Any items left after June 1, 2017 will be discarded.

<u>Reminder</u>. ADOT will not install a signal at the entrance to our community. It is recommended to use the signal at Bradshaw Mountain Road, via driving on Village Way (toward the Family Dollar store.) It only takes a minute or two of driving time and it is a safer option for those who do not wish to use the Hwy. 69 center-turn lane to exit or enter the Villages.

<u>Reminder</u>: Summer brings wildlife and insects; please do not prop open the laundry room or billiard room outside doors, to prevent snakes, lizards, bees and wasps from entering the rooms.

<u>Reminder</u>: Javelinas come into the Villages mostly at night. Do not leave birdseed, rodent bait or pet food, garbage or compost bags outside. They visit homes to find food, water or shelter. They can be dangerous. If you see a Javelina while walking your dog, avoid going near the animal and quickly take your dog in a different direction. Javelinas can carry rabies or distemper; if you or your pet is bitten, immediately seek medical attention.

<u>Reminder</u>. We are in high-fire danger months and much of our Community is surrounded by wild-land brush. Please do not discard any coals or wood from BBQ's or fireplaces in any outside area. Soak such materials in water until completely extinguished and then discard in the compactor.

<u>Reminder to Pet owners</u>: You are expected to follow the pet rules for the Villages (<u>CC&R's 3.5.7</u>). Animals must be under direct control of the resident when on their Lot and on a leash when off the Lot. <u>No resident shall permit their animal to relieve itself on another resident's Lot.</u> Retractable or standard leashes should be a maximum of 6 feet. The Prescott Valley City Animal Control Laws apply to the Villages. Complaints of barking dogs, and other animal nuisances should be reported, by the complainant, to the Prescott Valley Animal Control Unit at 928-772-5154. The Villages Management or H.O.A. Board is not responsible for handling animal complaints.

<u>Reminder</u>. Solicitors are not permitted in the Villages; No Soliciting signs are posted at all entrances. Solicitors will often tell residents they have permission by our Office. This is untrue. They are trespassing. Do not engage solicitors in conversation; do not allow them into your home. Advise them you are calling the Prescott Valley Police and then do immediately call the Police (non-emergency number 928-772-9267) and report details of the contact. Do not call the Office or Board members; call the Police.

A-C* NEWS FOR YOU: "It's Legal!"

Hi folks,

As you gear up to make improvements on your lot or the outside of your home, <u>be sure to check</u> the CC&R's (especially Article 3). If you have questions, our Villages' Manager or the members of the *Architectural Committee (A-C) will be glad to help you.

Did you know that when you bought your home/lot here in the Villages at Lynx Creek, you signed a contract with the HOA, that you will obey the HOA rules and declarations? This is a legal document, so please be familiar with the **CC&R's** and the "**Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations.**"

For example, did you know that <u>all</u> sheds MUST have skirting around the bottom to prevent animals and other critters from living under them? See Article 3, section 3.5.2, about the 3rd line from the bottom of the section.

Did you know that there is a limit to <u>only 2 cars</u>, or trucks to a lot (This *does not apply* to golf carts and 2-wheel vehicles) See Article 3, section 3.5.6.

Also, the HOA Board accepted new clarification on a couple of the "Architectural Rules and Regulations" as follows:

- Car port size is a minimum of 10'x20' (you must be able to park a car completely under the car port). This is in regard to new car port construction or for those who would make their existing car port smaller by adding a deck under the car port.
- 2. <u>Fences</u>: Due to the fact that 3-foot fences are becoming a rare commodity in hardware stores; our <u>new height limit for fences is now 4 feet</u>.

You can get a copy of the new clarifications of the "Architectural Rules and Regulations" in the office.

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

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


