Information from your Villages' Manager

ATTENTION: PET OWNERS

The Arizona Department of Agriculture is warning pet owners about the deadly bacteria: **Leptospirosis**. It's spread through bodily fluids like urine and humans can catch the bacteria, too. Normally the Valley sees about four cases a year. At this point, there are more than 40 confirmed cases in dogs.

The bacteria can live for months in wet soil, which is why the Valley normally doesn't see many cases with its dry conditions. Health officials aren't pinpointing where the infections started in the Valley, but they are warning pet owners to be cautious with doggy daycare and dog parks.

Pets will usually show symptoms when they are sick with the bacteria. Veterinarians say dogs will be tired, probably won't eat and drink a lot of water. The disease is treated by antibiotics but could be deadly if left untreated.

Scottsdale is the hardest hit city with other cases in Phoenix, Gilbert, Tempe, Litchfield Park, Fountain Hills and Avondale.





BLOCK WATCH

“CREATING SAFER NEIGHBORHOODS ONE BLOCK AT A TIME”

NEW YORK (CBS NewYork) — Authorities are issuing a warning about an unusual scam that could reach you through your phone.

If your phone rings and someone asks “Can you hear me now?” — hang up. Your answer to the simple question from an unknown caller could make you a victim of the scam.

What the scammer is trying to do is record your voice saying “yes!” thus authorizing unwanted charges on a phone or utility bill.

“It’s a verbal contract, just like clicking ‘I agree’ on a computer,” said Howard Schwartz of the Better Business Bureau. “It’s called a voice signature and it’s used legitimately by companies to show that you’ve agreed to some sort of a change, usually an upgrade in some sort of a plan.”

Tips to avoid this scam:

- **Don’t answer the phone from numbers you don’t know.**
- **Don’t confirm your number over the phone.**
- **Don’t give out personal information.**
- **Don’t answer questions.**

“If it’s an illegal marketing call and you press any button whatsoever, you’ve told them it’s a working number and you’re amenable to picking up the telephone when it rings,” Schwartz said.

Numbers can then be sold to many other scammers.

One of the best ways to protect yourself is to get on the do not call list.

A-C* NEWS FOR YOU: "Is It A Setback Or An Easement?"

DID YOU KNOW that all lots in the Villages have "setbacks" and "easements"? Did you know that *there really is a difference* between them? Here's how it works:

"Setbacks" are specific areas of your property that are designated by the Town of Prescott Valley where nothing can be built or otherwise occupy that space. Small plants are ok there, but the emergency personnel want a means to get around the outside of your house when it might become necessary to do so. So, there is a 3-foot setback along each side-lot line. Also, there is a 5-foot setback in the front of Park Model and RV lots; and, a 10-foot setback in the front of doublewide home lots.

"Easements", on the other hand, are locations on your property *where utilities cross your lot* – usually underground. Here in the Villages, most easements cross the back of our lots. In Park Model and RV lots, there is usually a 7.5 foot easement. In doublewide home lots there are mostly 10-foot easements (some have a 20-foot easement) across the back of the lots. Measure 7.5 feet, or 10 feet, from the back lot line towards the front of your property: That is the easement.

Because the water and sewer lines and some other utility lines are in the "easement", **it is strongly recommended that you do not put any permanent structure in the easements**. This is because any repairs that are needed to those utilities require digging up the broken lines. *Any structure that is in the way will be moved at the property owner's expense.*

The *Architectural Committee (A-C) will be glad to assist you in determining where your "easement" and "setback" is located and also what is permanent and what is temporary.

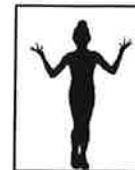

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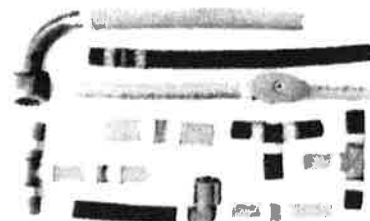
