ROAD WORK - PHASE 1 OF A 3-YEAR PROJECT

 Work being done by Dynamite Paving and Sealcoat, Inc. November 13 to November 15, 2017.

Crack seal pavement cracks ¼" wide and larger including the joint at the curb consisting of approximately 41,914 LF of cracks excluding alligator cracks. Work shall be performed in accordance with MAG Specification Section 337 (Revised 2014) excluding subsections: 337.4.1, 337.4.2, 337.5.5, 337.7 & 337.8.

Also, the company will be blowing the debris off the roads which possibly will go onto your property. We are sorry for the inconvenience.

"TIPS ON CHOOSING SHRUBS AND TREES TO PLANT"

From the Architectural Committee

The Architectural Committee, as an *arm* of the HOA Board, is here to help you in developing and maintaining a beautiful home in a beautiful community. Our emphasis is on *helping you*. In this light, we would like to share some insights for fall and spring planting that may be useful for your consideration when deciding on a tree or shrub to plant in your yard, as follows:

1) Consider *size:* Will your plant, *when mature*, fit the size of your yard *without becoming too big?* For example, the beautiful *Raywood Ash* gets 80' tall x60' wide – most yards are *about* 30'x40+'. This tree looks great on the farm.

If it **becomes too big**, several problems may arise, such as roof damage, preventing enough sunshine for smaller plants, growing over the fence and creating problems for your neighbors. Also, if a tree becomes too large and old, branches may break off onto someone's house.

- 2) Consider *the mess your tree may create* each year. This will mean more work for both you *and* your neighbors. Tree leaves, of course, are part of tree life. But if your tree produces pods, large seeds, long-term flowering, etc., it becomes a nuisance on small lots that are close together, and the Architectural Committee may suggest that you consider an alternative tree (and, if they don't, your neighbors will likely wish they had).
- 3) Another factor that *must be considered* is your tree or shrub's *water consumption*. Some plants demand large amounts of water and will invade water and sewer lines, creating very expensive problems. *Other trees*, however, are considered "*drought hardy*" or "*drought resistant*" and are usually desirable in our area, due to our location being in a high, semi-desert.

<u>Trees NOT accepted</u> are; Cottonwood, Willow, Maple, Arizona Cyprus, Raywood Ash and Sycamore (See "Architectural Rules & Regulations", p.8).

4) Finally, *check with resources* that might be able to help you. First, check your *CC&Rs* and the *Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations* in your Home Owner's Packet under "Landscaping". These will guide you so that you can present a positive "Request for Change" to the Architectural Committee. Then, **talk with the experts at area nurseries** (there are three of them in the Prescott and Prescott Valley area). Talk with *gardeners* who have worked here for many years about the kind of plants that grow well here and how to care for them. And, don't forget to use your **internet**. Internet search engines like "Google" (google.com), "ask Sam" (www.asksam.com), "Yahoo" (yahoo.com), etc. are loaded with helpful information.
