"THE IMPORTANCE OF THE "REQUEST FOR CHANGE"

From the Architectural Committee

Wow! It's been a very busy summer this year! There have been many home projects that have improved the value of the homes and of our community. This is wonderful for it shows pride in both our homes and our community.

However, the CC&Rs, which every home-owner in the Villages at Lynx Creek has signed in contract with the HOA when they bought their home here, states that all projects outside the house and on the lot must be approved by the Architectural Committee. Unfortunately, it appears that some people haven't reviewed their copy of the CC&Rs and the "Architectural Committee Rules" because they had either started their project, or finished it without submitting a "Request For Change" (RFC) to the Architectural Committee. PLEASE, be advised, that this will lead to fines. If a project is started or finished without the A-C approval, and it turns out that it would not have been approved, a fine imposed by the HOA will be assessed – and that project may have to be removed. (Ugh! Let's not go there – it isn't pleasant). Our CC&Rs have been ratified by the State of Arizona and are, therefore, a legal document backed by the State.

When the rules are kept, there is harmony in a community. When one or two break the rules, and it appears that they got away with it, everyone else becomes unsettled, and wonders what is going on. Soon others try to break the rules and then we have a lovely community - of chaos, where everyone is a law unto themselves. But this is not why we bought our homes here in the Villages at Lynx Creek. We live here because of the peace, quiet, friendliness, beauty, and continuity of our community.

PLEASE, submit an RFC to the Architectural Committee BEFORE YOU START A PROJECT. You must have the Villages' PERMIT before you start. It really isn't difficult: just fill out the front and back of one page, give a sketch on the provided graph paper, turn it in at the office on or before 9 AM on the 1st or 2nd Tuesday of the month, and attend the Architectural Meeting on either the 1st or the 3rd Wednesday at 9 AM in the Card Room (where you will receive the Permit). We honestly try hard to work with you, to help you accomplish your desired project but in accordance with the rules.




