The election results will be announced at the meeting.

Candidate Eligibility: Per The Villages at Lynx Creek Owners Association By-Laws, Article VI, Section 2; To be eligible as a candidate, a person must be an Owner in good standing for not less than twelve (12) months immediately preceding the close of the application period and be in physical residence not less than six (6) months of the twelve (12) months preceding the close of the application period. Previous interrupted Ownership and/or residency or rental shall not apply toward this requirement.

A-C* NEWS FOR YOU: *SPRING PLANTING?*

The **Architectural Committee*, as an arm of the HOA Board, is here to help you in developing and maintaining a beautiful home in our beautiful community. Our emphasis is on *helping you*. In this light, we would like to share some insights for Spring planting that may be useful to you.

Here are some helpful hints that you may want to consider when deciding on a **tree or shrub** to plant in your yard. **First**, will your plant fit the size of your yard without eventually becoming too big? If it becomes too big, several problems may arise, such as roof damage, preventing enough sunshine for smaller plants, growing over the fence and creating problems for your neighbors. Also, if a tree becomes too large and old, it can blow over onto someone's house. **Next**, consider the mess your tree will create each year. This will mean more work for both you *and* your neighbors. Tree leaves, of course, are part of tree life. But if your tree produces pods, large seeds, long-term flowering, etc., it becomes a nuisance, and the Architectural Committee may suggest that you consider an alternative tree (and, if they don't, your neighbors will likely wish they had). Check the CC&Rs

Another factor that must be considered is your tree or shrub's **water consumption**. Some plants demand large amounts of water and will invade water and sewer lines, creating very expensive problems; **these are not allowed**. However, **there are trees** considered "drought hardy" or "drought resistant" and are most desirable in our area. **Also, our CC&Rs** require that **no tree or plant above 3 feet tall be in the side yard setbacks** of your lot. And, for weed control consider a **pre-emergent** treatment in gravel and dirt areas (*just don't use it in flower or vegetable garden areas*).

Finally, it's always a good idea to start by *checking with resources* that might be able to help you. First, check your **CC&Rs and the Architectural Rules & Regulations** in your Home Owner's Packet, under "Landscaping". These will guide you so you can present a positive "*Request for Change*" to the Architectural Committee. **Also, you might talk with the experts** at our area nurseries (there are two of them in the Prescott and Prescott Valley area). Talk with gardeners and neighbors who have lived here for many years about the kind of plants that grow well here and how to care for them. And, don't forget to use your internet. Internet search engines like "Google" (google.com), "ask Sam" (www.asksam.com), "Yahoo" (yahoo.com), etc. are loaded with helpful information.

BLOCK WATCH

“Creating Safer Neighborhoods One Block at a Time”

There never seems to be a shortage of scams designed to separate you from your money. The “Secret Shopper Survey” scam is back as well as a “New Medicare Card” scam.

Secret Shopper Survey’ Scam – a resident will receive mailed instructions for enrolling in a program which will provide undercover surveys of local businesses. Included in the mailing is a check for a sum of money. A portion of the cash is for expenses, however, the largest portion is designated for the purchase of pre-paid credit cards. “The scam” – you will be asked to contact a person who will ask you for the credit card numbers so he can immediately withdraw the funds. The scammers rely on a timeline where the victim follows the directions immediately after depositing the check, after which the bank notifies you the check is fraudulent. By then the scammer has stolen the money and you are now responsible for the original deposit. See the Block Watch bulletin board for more details.

Do your research – Most legitimate offers are posted on line by reputable merchandizing firms. Never wire money to someone or agree to deposit a check for someone you don’t know. Never give personal or financial information online. Guard and treat it as if it were cash.

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) is required to remove SSN’s from Medicare cards by April, 2019 and replace it with a unique Medicare number to help prevent ID theft and fraud. The mailing of the new cards will begin April 2018. You are to destroy your old card after the new one arrives.

“The scam” – Someone claiming to be from “Medicare” calls and tells you that you need a temporary card until the new one arrives and offers to provide it for a fee that ranges between \$5 and \$50. They will also ask for bank or credit information so they can process the temporary card.

The new card will be mailed to you by CMS; you do not have to request it. Medicare will not call you unless you ask them to.

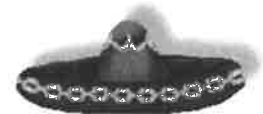

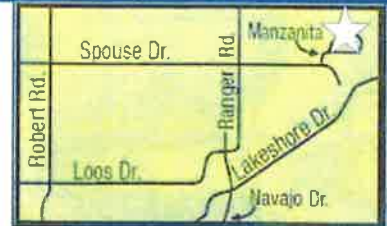

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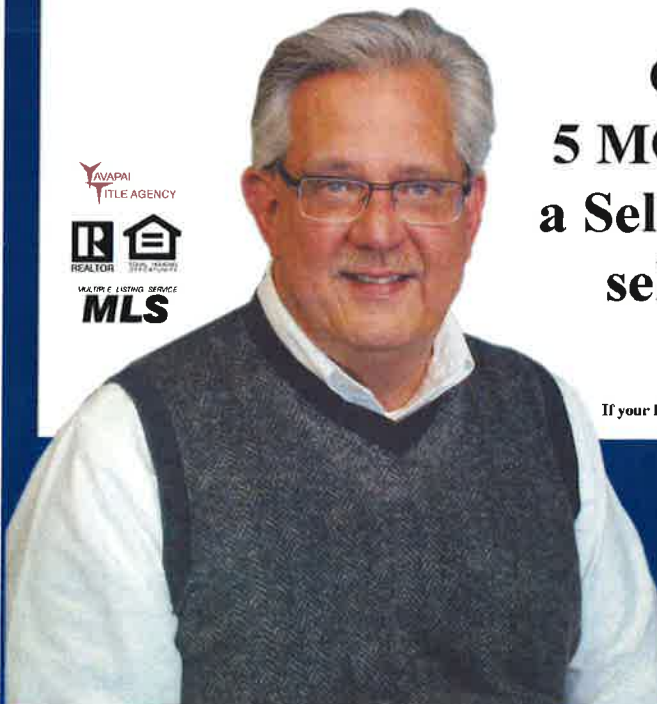
