These meetings will be held each Thursday at 2:30 PM in the Social Hall Aug 2, Aug 9, Aug 16, Aug 23, and Aug 30

Resident Reminders:

- ⇒ Per the Association Policies & Procedures, the Villages is **NON-SMOKING** (includes Vaping and E-Cigarettes) in all Community Common areas. The Community Common areas include <u>all areas and rooms within the complex</u> which is the <u>entire</u> interior courtyard, including pool, pergolas and gazebos. Also includes the tennis/pickleball courts, horseshoe pit, and the dog park,
- ⇒ The North Storage Area is now open. Storage of RV's is at your own risk.
- ⇒ Please do not 'drag' tables and chairs across the wood floors, especially the parquet Social Hall flooring; please lift and carry.
- ⇒ Please do not enter the Social Hall in wet bathing suits, to avoid slipping on the wood flooring. When entering any room within the complex, after being in the spa or pool, please dry your feet before entering;
- ⇒ Please be alert when walking in the evening or early morning hours. It is recommended you wear some type of reflective material or clothing so drivers can see you.
- ⇒ Also be alert for wildlife that may be on our streets during those hours. If you encounter javelinas or coyotes, immediately move away from them, especially if you are walking your pet(s). Do not leave any pet food, bird seed or garbage bags outdoors as that will attract animals. We have had frequent sightings of coyotes near our homes, so be vigilant and safe.

A-C* NEWS FOR YOU: TOOLS FOR GOOD NEIGHBORS

Historically, some very deadly ranch wars in the west were fought over fence lines. But this was when the fences kept cattle from water. It is a common American belief that since we own our property no one should be telling us what to do with it. But, in fact, while we (the Architectural Committee) sincerely sympathize with that belief, the fact is that in order for there to be harmony and peace in any community, there are community, city, county, state, and sometimes even federal rules that we all must abide by. In short, in a community, "no one is an island."

Therefore, how can we be a good neighbor, and to have good neighbors? A good tool is a fence. There is an old saying that, "fences make good neighbors." If you and your neighbor like to go back and forth between your house and theirs, then gates are quite useful.

Should you decide to be neighborly, and put a fence along your property line, here are some regulations and suggestions:

- 1) We are now allowed to erect a fence that is no taller than 4 feet (CC&Rs regulation).
- 2) Chain Link is allowed in the back and sides of your yard.
- 3) Decorative fence is allowed in the front and along a street.
- 4) The fence must be set back onto your lot at least 6 inches from the property line, unless you get written permission from your neighbor to erect the fence right on the property line.
- 5) You may also attach your fence to a neighbor's fence, also with their written permission.
- 6) While Privacy Screens are allowed, Privacy Fences are not allowed because they are over 4 feet tall.
- 7) Your property line is set by a survey, and there should be a *survey pin* at each corner of you lot. *If you cannot locate your pins*, **it is highly recommended that you hire a surveyor to re-survey your lot**. Do check the "Architectural Committee Rules and Regulations" in your home-owner's packet for more details.

Also, your outside home improvement projects must be approved by the Architectural Committee. When approved you are given a yellow permit. When your project(s) are done, please return the yellow permit, signed, to the office. When these are not turned in, it causes extra work for the Committee (who are all volunteers).

BLOCK WATCH

"Creating Safer Neighborhoods One Block at a Time" SAFETY ON WET ROADS

SAFE-DRIVING TIPS WHEN IT IS RAINING! GOOD VISION IN A DOWNPOUR

This method to achieve good vision while driving, during a heavy downpour, was shared by a Police officer who had experienced and confirmed it. It is useful...even driving at night.

Most motorists will turn windshield wipers on 'HIGH' or on the 'FASTEST SPEED' during heavy downpour, yet the visibility in front of the windshield is still bad. In the event you face such a situation, just put on your 'SUNGLASSES'! Suddenly, your visibility in front of your windshield is perfectly clear, as if there is no rain.

You'll also see where the rain bounces off the road. Wearing sunglasses works to eliminate the 'blindness' from passing cars, or the 'kick up' if you are following a car in the rain. Amazingly, you'll still see the drops on the windshield, but not the sheet of rain falling. Make sure you always have a pair of SUNGLASSES in your car. Try it yourself and share the information with your friends!

<u>NEVER</u>, <u>EVER</u>, DRIVE IN THE RAIN WITH YOUR CRUISE CONTROL ON. If the cruise control is on, your car will, in fact, begin to hydro-plane. When the tires lose contact with the road, your car will automatically accelerate to a higher rate of speed, making you take off like an airplane.

A police officer suggested this warning should be listed on the driver's seat sun-visor: NEVER USE THE CRUISE CONTROL WHEN THE ROAD IS WET OR ICY.'


