Enter your **Passcode** and click **LOGIN**

The Villages at Lynx Creek page appears. Your name and street address is in the upper right corner.

BLOCK WATCH

“CREATING SAFER NEIGHBORHOODS ONE BLOCK AT A TIME”

HOLIDAY HOME SAFETY TIPS EVERYONE SHOULD KNOW

As busy as holiday times are, you should set aside time to set up a holiday safety check list. . Following are ten tips to keep the season safe.

- 1. GIVE CANDLES CLEARANCE:** - Give candles at least 12 inches clearance all around and place them on sturdy bases protected by hurricane globes. TIP: Use flameless candles which operate on battery power and come in a variety of styles and colors.
- 2. COOK WITH CARE** – Remember, kitchen equipment is the leading cause of home fires
- 3. STAY WARM SAFELY** –Schedule a professional furnace check-up before the tech’s season becomes busy. Don’t use space heaters unless they’ve passed inspection and use with caution.
- 4. WATER THE TREE** – A tree that isn’t watered every day dries out quickly and ignites in seconds. Be sure that an artificial pre-lit tree is UL-rated.
- 5. CHECK THE LIGHTS** – Check for cracks, frays and loose connections. Be sure replacement bulbs match voltage and wattage. Do not overload extension cords or wall receptacles.
- 6. HANG LIGHTS CAREFULLY** – Secure outdoor lights with clips, hooks or insulated holders. Tacks, staples and nails damage wiring and cause arcing.
- 7. TURN OFF EVERYTHING** – Turn off the tree and outdoor lights when you go to bed or leave the house. TIP: Use properly rated timers. This also helps lower the electricity bill.
- 8. WINTERIZE THE HOUSE** - Property inspection helps spot potential problems with fireplaces, electrical issues and more.
- 9. SHARE WITH NEIGHBORS** – Let neighbors know when you will be away so they can watch your home. This is a page out of Block Watch,
- 10. HAVE A PLAN** – Fires occur more often during the holidays so it is important to have an evacuation plan. Know the safe egress routes and locations should you need to get out quickly.

BE AWARE, ‘TIS THE SEASON FOR SCAMS

- 1. FLY-BY-NIGHT AND PHISHING SCAMS** - Shop only with reputable merchants; verify website authenticity or type in the ‘url’ yourself. Use a credit card and not debit card for online purchases.
- 2. CHARITY SCAMS** – Be wary of hi-pressure ‘donate NOW’ pitches. Avoid charities that won’t answer reasonable questions, and never give cash or supply any credit card info via email or phone. Verify charity authenticity, if you’ve never heard of the charity.
- 3. GIFT CARD SCAMS** – If possible, purchase gift cards online, or from businesses, but only if they are kept behind the counter or available upon request.
- 4. HOLIDAY E-CARD SCAMS** – Don’t click on any E-cards if there is any doubt of its authenticity; don’t click on links inside. Delete E-cards from anyone you don’t know, without opening or reading them.

**SUBJECT: SOCIAL HALL DECORATIONS
(SEASONAL; HOLIDAYS, SPECIAL AND PERSONAL EVENTS)**

**PURPOSE: RULES FOR THE DECORATING COMMITTEE
AND/OR RESIDENT'S PERSONAL EVENT**

NOTE: A copy of these Rules must be given, by the Office Staff, to any resident-sponsor of a personal event, who reserves the Social Hall.

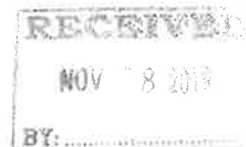
- I. It is the responsibility of the Decorating Committee to inventory, maintain, purchase and/or discard Social Hall decorations. The Annual Budget allocated for Social Hall decorations is established and approved each year by the H.O.A. Budget Committee.
- II. Decorations are permitted only on the following surfaces:
 - (a) Round or rectangular dining tables.
 - (b) Columns' décor (limited to using existing hooks)
 - (c) No other hooks, nails, screws, pushpins, etc. may be attached to any wall surfaces.
 - (d) Limited stage-apron surface: Any decoration that is placed on the stage-apron floor surface must be artificial. Under no circumstances may decorations of any kind be attached to, or placed near enough to touch the Main Stage curtains and/or the Front Stage-Apron Curtains.
 - (e) Fresh flower or plant containers may be placed on tables or on stands on the Social Hall floor. Fresh flower or plant containers may not be set directly on the floor or stage.
 - (f) The two (2) wood tables used for ticket sales may be temporarily decorated for special events.
- III. Decorations may not be placed on the following surfaces:
 - (a) Bingo equipment, piano, television and other media equipment.
 - (b) To prevent damage to window-tinting material, decorations may not be taped/attached to the inside of entry door windows.
 - (c) Decorations may not be hung from the ceiling.
- IV. No **fire-lit** items may be used, such as candles, lanterns, etc.

Christmas Decorations:

Trees, round dining table centerpieces and column décor may be displayed early-December and must be removed and stored no later than two (2) weeks after December 25th. This allows other theme-décor to be displayed, for Association-related and/or personal events.

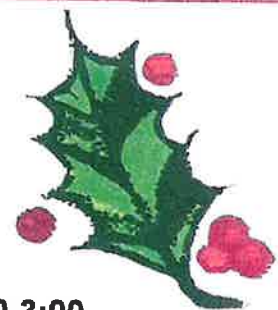
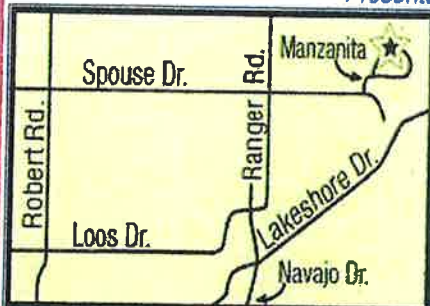

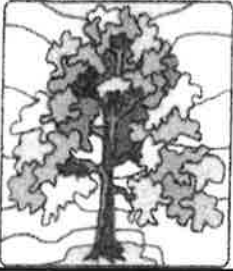
