“Creating Safer Neighborhoods, One Block at a Time”

WILDFIRE SAFETY TIPS

Wildfire risks are extremely high right now. We have recently seen numerous fires all around us. Most were quickly contained; however, some of those in the path of the Viewpoint Fire were not as fortunate. The cause of many of the fires was assumed to be the dragging of trailer safety chains causing sparks. Unfortunately I was extremely disappointed when on two occasions I witnessed the tossing of lit cigarette butts from vehicles.

Just this past May 14th, a grassland fire occurred very close to us near Fain Road and Lakeshore Drive. May I remind all that we are surrounded by these same types of grassy areas? Being fire wise and prepared is critical. Below are just a few tips on keeping our community safer. Look for more information on community bulletin boards, or email me if you wish more detailed information.

Around your home:

Clear leaves and debris from roofs, gutters and decks and from under decks to within 10 feet of your home.

Screen in areas below patios and decks.

Remove flammable materials within 30 feet of your home's foundation or sheds and garages.

Inspect roof shingles and replace those that are loose or missing.

Cover attic and soffit vents with wire mesh no Larger than 1/8 inch.

Enclose eaves.

Vehicle safety:

Be sure chains and other metal parts aren't dragging.

Check tire pressure; exposed wheel rims cause sparks.

Avoid driving or parking on dry grass; hot exhausts can start a fire and you may not notice it until it's too late.

Never let brake pads wear too thin; metal on metal makes sparks.

Above all, please remember to be prepared and have a plan if you need to evacuate.

A-C* NEWS FOR YOU:HOME & YARD IMPROVEMENTS – SOME REMINDERS

Wow! It's spring again, and time that many of us will be sprucing up our yards, painting our homes, and improving our landscapes. It is exciting to see so many folks improving their homes and lots – it shows home-ownership integrity and pride. This helps all of us to feel better about living here. Thanks to you all.

As you plan and prepare to make improvements to the outside of your home and/or your lot, please remember that a **Request For Change (RFC)** must be submitted and approved by the ***Architectural Committee BEFORE** you start the project. Upon approval you will be given the Villages' **Permit** – a yellow paper, which is to be placed so it may be seen from the street while you are doing your project. **Upon completion of your project** please *sign the back of the yellow Permit*, and return it to the main office. You are given 4 months to complete your project, but if more time is needed, an extension of time may be granted. Failure to submit an RFC before the project possibly COULD result in a penalty.

The **Architectural Committee works hard to help you** accomplish your project goals according to the CC&R's rules. Also, if you would like to know if your lot is in any way **in non-compliance with the CC&Rs**, please **submit an RFC** requesting us to observe your property with you, and we will contact you to set an appointment with you to do that. This could be especially helpful if you are planning to sell your house. *The Escrow check that we do at the time of sale* usually does not provide enough time for you to make any necessary improvements, as our report goes to Escrow soon before closing.

If your project requires **construction** (i.e., shed, carport, deck, cement work, etc.), it is your responsibility to also check with the *Town of Prescott Valley* **for their permit**. This is for your own protection against a lawsuit in case someone gets hurt because of faulty construction.

HIGH FIRE DANGER

WHAT TO DO DURING WATCHES OR WARNINGS:

- » Make sure there's at least a 72-hour supply of important medications in your go-bag
- » Know which personal items, (pictures, documents, etc.) have been prioritized to take if time permits, when evacuation is necessary
- » Remove deck/ patio furniture, cushions and door mats to prevent ember ignitions
- » Remove portable propane tanks from the deck/patio
- » Know how to turn off the gas to the home
- » Place a ladder against the house (for Fire Department use)
- » Have your garden hoses connected (for Fire Department use)
- » Make sure windows, doors and garage doors are closed
- » Make sure windows are closed on vehicles that will remain at the residence while you're evacuated

When returning home after evacuation:

Even if your home survived the fire, there may be the need to clean-up and restoration of your home and property from retardant, damaged trees or smoke damage

Check with your local Office of Emergency Management for information on resources for down/damaged trees and powerlines

Notify your local Health Department if retardant is in ponds, streams or near wells

Contact your Insurance Agent for assistance with restoration from retardant or smoke/fire damage to your structure
