## A-C\* NEWS FOR YOU: PLEASE THINK AHEAD

*Important Information for Your Lot Improvements*

Hi folks. You know, whenever folks buy into an HOA community they sign a contract to obey the rules of the community which are contained in the **CC&R's** and the "**Architectural Rules & Regulations**". As you probably have guessed by now, the purpose of the Architectural Committee (A-C) is to assist you, as lot owners, in improving your lots and the *outside* of your homes in keeping with the **CC&R's** and *Architectural Rules*.

Sometimes people get aggravated over having to submit a "**Request For Change**" (**RFC**) (*these forms are at the front office*) and to wait for approval. As aggravating as it may seem, it is necessary for keeping our community beautiful and a pleasant place to live. It is also in the rules, which we all agreed to, that this must be done. In general, this means that any of your *outside* improvements **must be approved by the A-C BEFORE work is started** (emergency situations are handled differently). *It may take 1 to 3 weeks to get an approval from the A-C.* Since most people plan their projects ahead of time, and arrange for contractors ahead of time, *it makes sense that **then is the time to submit your Request for Change** – not after you have started the project or a contractor is scheduled.* This includes *replacing shingles on roofs, planting of shrubs and trees with a mature height over 3 feet and installing antennas.*

**Also**, the Town of Prescott Valley requires a Building Permit on most construction. It is the lot owner's responsibility to obtain any needed city permits. **The A-C needs to see evidence of a permit BEFORE granting permission on construction projects** – including replacing roof shingles (see "*The Villages at Lynx Creek Architectural Rules and Regulations*" [2017], **page 2, bottom paragraph**).

The A-C is committed to making sure that our homes remain safe, and attractive, and while doing so we hold to the responsibility of insuring our community remains in compliance with our rules. As we all keep to those principles we will insure a beautiful and enjoyable community to live in *and* keep our property values up.

## BLOCK WATCH

“Creating Safer Neighborhoods One Block at a Time”

### STOPPING SPAM CALLS

Unwanted phone calls and texts are surging, no matter what efforts lawmakers take to stop them. It's nothing personal and spammers often don't know who owns the targeted numbers. You can try not picking up the phone but the calls that reach your voicemail could flag that your phone is working and ripe for future calls. Here are some do-it-yourself defenses that can help reduce those calls.

**Answer with silence**-When you say hello or anything, automated voice-activated calls launch the robo-call or transfers you to a call center, but saying nothing usually disconnects these calls. If it's a live caller, wait for that person to break the silence and then hang-up if you don't recognize the caller. Your announcement should not contain any personal info such as name, alternate phone numbers, etc. Your friends and family will know if they have reached the correct number.

**Use an APP**-There are many apps Smartphone users can employ to block some fraudulent calls. Some are free and others cost a few dollars a month. AT&T offers “Call Protect”; Verizon has “Caller Name ID”; Sprint offers “Premium Caller ID and T-Mobile has “Scam ID:” and “Scam Block”. You can also buy apps like “YouMail” and “RoboKiller”.

**Know which calls to avoid**-The most common calling cons are those that promise to reduce credit card debt and rates; offer you pre-approved loans; offer free or low cost vacations, time shares, home security systems or from government and utility company imposters.

**A dropped or “One-ring” call**-This is a ruse to get you to call back. AVOID CALLING BACK OR ANSWERING AREA CODES: (268), (284), (473), (649), (664), (767), (809), (828), (849), (876). These calls originate from Caribbean countries with very high calling rates. Robocall frequency tends to be highest on Friday and Tuesday.

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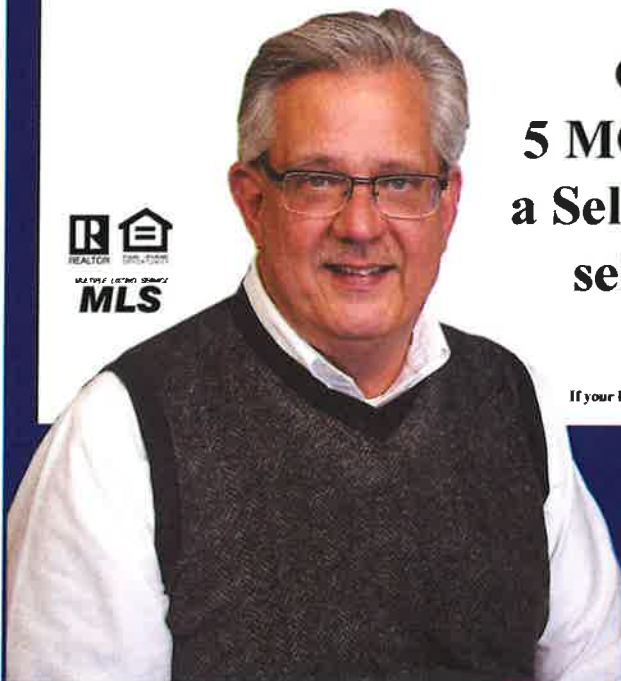
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
