NOTES FROM YOUR BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Budget: Before the 2019 Budget goes to the Board for approval, there will be an Owners' Town Hall Meeting (in October) for a Budget Review. This will be an opportunity for Owners to give their input on budget items. The Town Hall meeting date/time has not been set as of this newsletter print date; that information will be posted on all bulletin boards and announced via robo-call as soon as determined.

Mosquitoes: Due to our strong rain (Monsoon) season, 'standing' water has accumulated in drain pipes (from roof gutters) causing breeding sites for mosquitoes. It is recommended residents spray insecticide into their drainpipes as well as spraying any other 'standing' water on their property.

Driving: The speed limit on our streets is 10 mph; for <u>all</u> motorized vehicles. The right-of-way rule is: Pedestrians first; golf carts-wheelchairs-bicycles 2nd and vehicles are 3rd. Pedestrians are expected to be vigilant when walking on the streets; watch for vehicles and wear reflective clothing during dark hours.

Owners who rent property: Your renters <u>must</u> register at the Villages' office. They need to provide age verification and if they have a dog(s), a pet registration and immunization records will be required. Also, renters need to follow the Villages' Rules & Regulations; a copy may be obtained at the office. Renters have the same responsibility as owners to follow our community rules.

Very Important - To all residents who rent spaces in the R.V. storage lots - PLEASE REMEMBER TO LOCK THE GATE TO THE RV STORAGE WHEN EXITING. The best way to keep residents' R.V.'s as safe as possible is to keep the gates closed and locked.

Leaves: Our Autumn Season is here - leaves are beginning to fall. Please be proactive and remove leaves from your property before they accumulate and blow onto your neighbor's property or into the street.

Winterize: For residents leaving the Villages for the Winter season, please remember we experience freezing temperatures and encourage you to "winterize" your water supply pipes and shutoffs to avoid possible damage to your property. NOTES FROM THE COMMUNITY MANAGER

IT IS REQUIRED THAT ALL NEW OWNERS AND ALL RENTERS REGISTER AT THE VILLAGES' OFFICE TO MAKE SURE YOUR EMERGENCY AND CONTACT INFORMATION IS CURRENT.

In the event of emergencies, such as water line breaks, utility problems, community street closures, etc., a 'ROBO-CALL' will be made to your phone number to notify you of such events. Please make sure your current phone number is on file at the Villages' Office so you will receive ROBO-CALL information promptly.

Important: Any newly purchased properties within the Villages, whether purchased with Cash or Financed,

<u>MUST</u> go through the FirstService Residential Resale Process.

The Resale/Disclosure process is dictated by Arizona State Statute, 33-1260 (for Condos) and 33-1806 (for single family homes). These statutes require us to provide a statement to the title company along with putting the documents for the community into the mail to the perspective buyer. The statute also allows us to charge for this event. (Standard fee is typically \$400.00 - \$155.00 Transfer/ \$245.00 disclosure and if rush, \$245.00 + \$100.00 = \$345.00 to equal \$500.00) If you have any questions, please direct them to the following email address: RNDResearch.az@fsresidential.com

"Creating Safer Neighborhoods One Block at a Time"

THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CRIMINAL ISSUES AND COMMUNITY ISSUES AND WHO YOU SHOULD CALL

For all residents of the Villages, particularly those who are new to our community, although we have a Dewey mailing address and zip code, the Villages is in the City of Prescott Valley (P.V.) and the P.V. Police Department takes care of any "criminal/crime" issues.

Block Watch participation is being aware of your 'neighborhood'...your neighbors, cars, homes, property... it is noticing when something does "not look right."

Please <u>DO NOT</u> call the Villages' contact phone numbers or Block Watch Liaison if you see any type of criminal activities. They do not have the authority to address these issues nor the training. It would also cause a delay in getting any official response and diminish the accuracy of the report. Do not approach and put yourself at risk. If you witness <u>criminal activity</u>, immediately dial 911 and report it. If you witness <u>suspicious activity</u>, immediately call the P.V. Police Department non-emergency phone 928-772-9267.

Please <u>DO call</u> the Villages' contact numbers listed in the box below if you observe "non-crime" issues such as water leaks, open windows, lights out, etc., in the <u>Villages' common areas</u>. (streets, courtyard, social hall and other rooms in the complex, tennis courts, etc.) For these you may call the Office during work hours, or after-hours call the FSR Management number to leave a message, or the Villages' Monitor on Duty or a Board Member to make a report. These issues are handled by Villages' personnel; they do not take care of "crime" issues.

A-C* NEWS FOR YOU: What ARE those Silly "Yellow Permits"?

By Rick for the *Architectural Committee

Why are those "silly Yellow Permits" so important? Well, these are the Villages At Lynx Creek permits (you may still need to get a permit for construction projects from the town of Prescott Valley.) Our permits convey the message that you have presented your outside projects to the HOA Architectural Committee for approval according to the CC&Rs. Therefore, they are to be placed where they can be plainly seen from the street until the project is done. After the project is done, they are to be signed by you and turned in to the office. Those Yellow Permits mean the following:

- 1. It means that your project/s, as stated in your "Request For Change" (RFC) is cleared by the HOA's Architectural Committee.
- 2. It means that your project meets the CC&Rs rules.
- 3. It especially means that your neighbors won't be upset thinking that you might be doing something outside of the CC&Rs, and call the office to complain.
- 4. And, <u>IMPORTANTLY</u>, the Yellow Permit MUST BE RETURNED to the office when your project is done, so that the *Architectural Committee* can close out the file.
 - a. <u>If it is not returned</u> after 4 months the Committee will be contacting you to see why the project is not done yet.
 - b. Sometimes people start a project only to let it drag on for a year or more. This is not acceptable. Granted, <u>sometimes there are legitimate reasons</u> for going past 4 months to finish a project. When there is a legitimate reason, <u>the Committee allows extensions</u> to give you time to finish a project.

So, please keep in mind that those "silly Yellow Permits" are <u>very important</u> – to you, to your community, and to the Architectural Committee. <u>PLEASE return them to the office</u> when your project is finished, so we won't have to chase you down. Thank you for understanding.
