PHASE 2 ROAD PROJECT

Important notice to all who reside on the following lots:

Lots 320-457. Work to be done Sept 4th

Lots 1-115 and Lots 250-319. Work to be done Sept 5th

All roads north of Village Creek Blvd including Creekview Drive, Wild Walnut Drive, Mesquite Tree Drive, Pine Drive, Countryview Drive, Mountain Brush Drive, Ponderosa Pine Drive, Travertine Way, Obsidian Loop Road, Stonehenge Way and Peppertree Way **will be closed to all traffic including all wheeled vehicles, golf carts and bicycles for 24 hours according to the above dates and lots. Do not walk or walk pets on road surface.**

These streets will be Slurry Seal coated.

Please, plan your daily activities to avoid the need to drive on these streets during these 24 hours times. Plan your day by perhaps: staying at home for 24 hours, take a mini vacation for 24-48 hours, avoid scheduling any appointments on your day, doing shopping or errands the weekend before. Any vehicle parked on the street when work begins will be towed. In case of emergency, Fire/Ambulance has priority.

We understand the inconvenience to those who are affected; however, the Slurry Seal coating process requires warm temperatures, it cannot be postponed to cooler months. This project was scheduled as close to the end of the summer season as possible to reduce the impact on our residents. If you have an appointment that cannot be rescheduled or you work, you may park your vehicle in the open area opposite the mailboxes, but try to avoid walking on the coated streets as much as possible. You will get it on your shoes. If you drive on it, you will damage your car and the road surface.

We thank you for your cooperation during this road project and apologize for the unavoidable inconvenience to our residents.

NOTES FROM YOUR BOARD OF DIRECTORS

We are pleased to introduce our new FirstService Residential Community Manager, Patty Harmon. We also have a new Maintenance employee, Joe Girard.

IMPORTANT: Villages' HOA Meeting Minutes/Financials will no longer be emailed to Owners from the Villages' office. Community information is readily available to Owners by using a Passcode to access 'Our Community' on FirstService Residential's Website. Easy Instructions to set up a Passcode are on the following page.

Reminder: All dogs need to be registered at the Villages office. Dogs and other pets are not allowed inside the courtyard or any of the rooms; the only exception is a Certified Service Animal per A.R.S. 511-1024.

The Villages is in the City of Prescott Valley, which has a Law (Animal Control Code 6 01-110 #4); which states:"...while such dog is restrained by a leash, rope, cord or chain of not more than six (6) feet in length when off the the premises of the owners..."

Long (retractable) leashes are dangerous for our residents walking, bicycling, driving golf carts or other motorized vehicles. There have been several instances of long retractable leashes tripping people here in our community, so please be responsible pet owners and use no more than a six-foot leash when walking your dog within the Villages. All residents will appreciate your consideration.

Reminder: Do not walk dogs on residents' lot and do not allow your dog to use a resident's lot as their 'toilet.' Your animal may use the street to "do its business" and you must always pick up after your pet and discard droppings in the compactor. Please do not discard feces in the open trash receptacle by the office as this promotes flies and emits bad smells to anyone in the vicinity.

Per Villages' Rules and Regulations, The parking of any type of vehicle on the street directly opposite another vehicle is essentially blocking the street and is prohibited. This rule is to assure the passage of emergency vehicles of all types in all residents' interest. No overnight street parking is permitted for passenger vehicles. No guest RV street parking is allowed at any time.

Per Villages' Rules and Regulations, A homeowner must accompany family and guests at all times when using the amenities.

Block Watch Keys for Safety and Security

Successful criminals look for easy, profitable targets. They do not want to enter facilities that are well lighted and difficult to access and egress.

Following are basic keys that will help achieve some measure of safety and security.

Know your neighbors well enough to be able to determine when they are not at home and what kind of activities are not normal and suspicious in nature.

Remove targets of opportunity. Keep doors and sheds locked. Keep valuable items out of sight or locked up.
Use common sense and don't advertise your absence.

Be aware and alert and **DO NOT CONFRONT** suspicious persons or activities. Report any suspicious person/s or activity to the **POLICE** immediately. **REMEMBER:** Call 911 for **emergencies only**. Call **928-772-9261** for suspicious and any other non-emergency or non-life threatening situations.

LIGHTS! LIGHTS! LIGHTS! Criminals don't like lights or noises.. Make it as difficult as possible for criminals to break our security and enter our property and homes.

Have motion sensor flood lights illuminate critical areas around your home. Place lights high enough to be out of the reach of criminals.

A-C* NEWS FOR YOU: CARING FOR YOUR TREES

Well folks, hot summers make us think about shade, and trees are a great source of shade. While some people will want a new tree, others may have removed an old and dangerous tree and need to replace it with a younger tree. It may be September, but it's not too late to plant most trees; in fact, gardeners say it's a great time.

However, ***be careful when choosing a tree***. Consider how big the "adult" tree will be, regarding potential damage to your or your neighbors' buildings (i.e., the beautiful *Raywood Ash* can get 60'-80' tall AND wide. Our lots average approximately 40' – 50' wide). Be thoughtful of your neighbors, as the tree should not encroach over their property. **Trees and shrubs that die** and are to be *removed and replaced* with another tree (please consult the **CC&Rs, Articles 3.13, and 7.2**).

Also, there are **4 other trees**, besides the Raywood Ash, that are **forbidden** in the Villages because they are very messy and will invade water and sewer lines causing extensive damage. They are the: **Cottonwood, Willow, Maple, and Arizona Cypress**. However, while the Arizona Cypress is not permitted, the Italian or Mediterranean or Leyland Cypress **are permitted**).

Also, please consider our climate, including winds; and, consult the **Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations, page 8**, under "Landscaping"; "Trees".

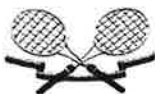

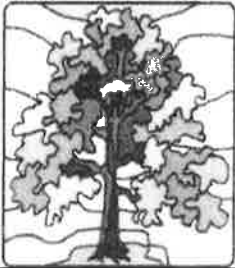
