



Well folks, here we are in another New Year – 2019. In many ways it's a time for new beginnings and new ideas to put into play. Sometimes those ideas include improving our home inside and/or outside, including the yard. When they do, please remember the CC&Rs that help us to keep our community beautiful. They state that any improvements to the lot or the outside of the house must be pre-approved by the Architectural Committee. This begins with your submitting a "Request For Change" form, describing what you want to do to improve your property.

The "Request For Change" forms are available in the Villages' office. These need to be filled out and submitted to the Committee for approval <u>BEFORE</u> work is to be started. Upon approval, you will be given a <u>yellow Permit</u> that is to be placed where it can be seen from the street during the work on your project. You are given up to 4 months to finish your project (extension of time is available as needed). When your project is finished, <u>the</u> <u>yellow Permit MUST be signed</u>, <u>dated</u>, <u>and turned in to the Villages' office</u>.

May your New Year be a joyful one throughout the whole year. The Architectural Committee (all are volunteers and fellow home-owners here) will do our best to be of help to you in accomplishing your desired project (s) according to the CC&Rs.
