Food Handlers Card

I have been in contact with the County
Health Department about scheduling a food
handlers' class for the Villages. At present,
the Villages has a restriction of ten people in
the Social Hall. We need to wait until the
Covid-19 numbers decrease before we can
open the Social Hall for larger events. We
do not plan on any large events soon.
Several people are wanting to renew their
cards, so they are ready when we can return
to normal.

My card expired in May. I recently went to the County Environmental Health Office located at 1090 Commerce Drive in Prescott to renew my Food Handlers Card. You will need to provide a Government issued ID such as a Drivers License and have completed the questions in the food handlers book. Tell them you are a VOLUNTEER at the Villages at Lynx Creek. Volunteer cards are free, a two-year card for employee's costs \$15; there is no need to pay the \$15. You may be asked to take a test; I was told volunteers do not need to take the test the day I renewed my card.

"Trees Make Beautiful Shade"

Well folks, hot summers make us think about shade, and trees are a great source of shade, and fresh oxygen. Even though it's October, it's still not too late to plant most trees; in fact, gardeners say it's a great time.

However, a word of caution: Consider <u>how big</u> the "adult" tree will be, regarding potential damage to your or your neighbors' buildings (i.e., the beautiful Raywood Ash can get 60'-80' tall AND wide. Our lots average approximately 40' – 50' wide). Be thoughtful of your neighbors, as the tree should not encroach over their property.

Also, if you want to plant a tree or a bush <u>in the front yard</u>, please think ahead to when the tree will be <u>full grown</u>. It should be planted so that it <u>will not block a neighbor's view for backing out of their driveway</u>.

You should also know that there are <u>5 trees</u> that are forbidden in the Villages. They are the: <u>Cottonwood, Raywood Ash, Willow, Maple, and Arizona Cypress</u>. These trees are incredibly messy, and will also seek water pipes and sewer lines for nutrition causing extensive damage.

However, while the Arizona Cypress is not permitted, the Italian or Mediterranean or Leyland Cypress <u>are permitted</u>).

Also, please consider our climate, including winds; and, consult the <u>Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations</u>, page 8, under "Landscaping"; "Trees".



Wood Shop News

Ready for a rerun. This month we are going to look at some projects similar to ones we have shown in prior months.

Our first one is a bird house made from Cedar wood. The builder did some research and found out that birds seen to like houses with out a perch outside better than ones with a perch. With no perch it is more like a hole in a tree trunk and more desirable to the birds.

This is a great project for beginners. No matter your experience level, with the help of the monitors who are in the shop weekdays from 9 am to noon you too can turn out some fun projects.





This month's other project is another picture of bowls made in the shop. These pieces combine some puzzle work with wood turning on the lathes in the shop. Small pieces of wood have been glued together to make the body of the bowl while larger pieces were used for the base and the lid. You can learn all you need to know to do this in the shop from the monitors. Hope you can come in soon but remember your mask.







Hello Villages residents, I will be resuming the Block Watch Crier articles and will start with a simple explanation of the program and a request for your help.

What Does a Block Watch Involve?

The purpose of the Neighborhood Watch program is to create an alert neighborhood by using simple crime prevention methods which involves: Neighbors getting to know each other and working together in a program of mutual assistance

Learning to recognize and report suspicious activities

Implementing crime prevention techniques, keeping you and your home from being targets of opportunity

Remembering law enforcement can't be everywhere at once, so we can be their eyes and ears.

Block Watch Group Meetings (When we can conduct them safely)
Block Watch meetings will include discussion with the Block Watch Coordinator,
Prescott Valley Police Department and Yavapai Emergency Management Liaison or
other responder representatives

Block Watch Captain's Responsibilities

The following is provided to assist you in better understanding the role as a Block Watch Captain.

Conduct yourself as a leader with truthfulness and respect for others
Act as liaison between the Block Watch coordinator and police liaison
Talk to your neighbors in your area to see if they are interested in joining your
group

Contact neighbors to discuss possible crime problems, their needs for assistance and suggestions for program improvement

Maintain a list of the names, physical and email addresses and phone numbers of your Block Watch group members and pass it on the Block Watch coordinator. Have Block watch members fill out a Special Needs form and pass these on to the Block Watch coordinator.

These data sheets are important to the Block Watch program. Not only do they serve as contact information for the Block watch but also for all emergency responder personnel as well. This information will help emergency organizations plan for when we may need emergency assistance. All information and data sheets are kept confidential and not used for any other purposes.

I appreciate those that have volunteered to be Block Watch captains, but we are in need of many more Please contact me if you are interested or just want additional information or if there is any safety or emergency preparedness information you would like covered in future Crier articles.

Happy Birthday Paulette Price

Paulette Price is celebrating her 100th birthday on October 10th. She was born in Urbana, Indiana, but her story didn't start there. Her parents met in Paris, France, during World War I. Her French mother, a teacher who spoke fluent English, was working at the USO where her parents met. Paulette met her future husband, Jim, years later while she was working as a Red Cross Girl at Warrington Air Force Base in England during World War II. He proposed to her on the dock in New York City when she returned to the states. Jim and Paulette had a nice lifestyle living mostly in California. He was an electrical engineer and they had three sons 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ years apart. They enjoyed skiing and even built their own ski cabin in Mammoth Lakes. Then one night when Jim was coming home from a meeting, he was in a car accident on the freeway and was killed. It changed Paulette's life. She stayed in California and raised the boys. Jim had left them with good insurance. Finally Paulette and Andy, the youngest moved to the cabin in Mammoth Lakes where



they lived until she was convinced by her two older sons to move to Arizona.

Paulette moved to The Villages in 1998. She had a friend from California who had moved here previously. She has seen a lot of changes since moving here. The Villages was a small community then. Mobile homes were on display for sale on the Fain property at the entrance to The Villages. Paulette picked out her house then selected her lot and told them not to put it in backwards! She chose a lot on Stonehenge. The lots on the north side of the street were all empty. When it rained they turned into a pond. Someone put up a sign saying "No Fishing!"

She said sewage was a terrible problem at first, but the problem was solved when they hooked up to Prescott Valley sewage. Everyone was assessed \$500.00 to get hooked up and from then on they had a reliable sewage system. She also remembers the time that half of a house was brought in, but it was set on the wrong side of the lot. When the second half was brought in the mistake was discovered. They had to take the second half back, unload it, come back and pick up the first half, place it on the correct side of the lot, go get the second half and finally unload it where it belonged. Another time they set up a house in the middle of two lots with $\frac{1}{2}$ of each lot on either side. The homeowner who was all set up including furniture refused to move as it wasn't his fault. She believes it is still that way to this day.

Paulette remembers when Lucy was the General Manager. She was the only staff member and she was paid by Fain. Volunteers worked in the office one day per week answering the phone, answering questions and taking people around who were interested in buying a place. Volunteers also took charge of one Activity. Saturday night was Dance Night. There would be a band and refreshments brought by the residents. People from outside of the community were allowed to attend to help pay for the band. It was discontinued due to the liability of having people drink then drive home.

HOA dues were \$65.00 when Paulette moved here. There have been two assessments she remembers: the sewage hook up and another one for roofs due to a hailstorm. Every roof had to be repaired or replaced. She also remembers roofing nails all over the streets. She had three flat tires in one week.

I asked Paulette about the challenges in her life. She said she has never been a drinker, but she did enjoy a glass of wine while she was preparing dinner. Now she can't have that. And she added, losing her husband changed her life and their sons' lives.

Paulette says the best thing about being 100 is waking up every day then she quickly adds seeing her children doing well and being good Christians. Paulette has always lived a healthy life. She says she has probably hiked every trail in Yosemite. She wants everyone to know she has been a good Christian all her life and so are her sons. That's important to her.

As she celebrates 100 years, let's raise a toast to Paulette Price; a life spanning decades, continents, world wars and a century of memories.




