#### **MANAGER'S REPORT**

#### October 2023

At the last Meet the Manager's Meeting, I announced that Randy Wolfenden was resigning from the Executive Board. Thank you, Randy, for all of your hard work and sacrifice to serve on the Board and your great guidance as the Chair of the Architectural Committee. Rich gave an update on Maintenance. Mailbox pedestal replacement, 20 light pole repair, winter maintenance of the dog park and the landscaping in the common area – dethatching and feeding and painting of the numbers on the curbs that were not completed last winter.

Cathy Edwards gave a report from the Recreation Sub Committee on the open area (old Bocce Ball court). The plan calls for a putting green, pergolas for shading, a firepit, shuffleboard, an open turf area for gathering and lighting over the next several years. She and her Committee did a great job and put in a lot of hours.

The Use agreement between the Villages and Village Bingo was finalized and put into effect. The Recreation Committee submitted a change to the Board of Directors to change policy 3.07.

A discussion was held regarding possible leasing of rv spaces in the North Lot to Desert Pines. Gail, Steve and Bob met with Kevin Lollar and Mark VanWormer and Desert Pines decided that they do not wish to rent a portion in entirely from the Villages. They asked if it would be possible to place storage units for storing goods in the lot and they were told that the space cannot be used for that purpose. Instead, they asked that we submit to the Association a plan to rent individual RV spaces to resident of Desert Pines and an additional cost.

I distributed a copy of the bylaws with proposed changes. After discussion with residents and with the Board, the Executive Board decided to have the attorney revised the Bylaws to meet all current statutes.

The Board has proposed that a policy be written to automatically increase the cost of storage based upon inflation as it is for the Asset Preservation, HOA Disclosure and HOA Transfer fees.

The Association will purchase a new copier to replace the leased copier. It will cost approximately \$9,700.00 with a service agreement of 225.00 per month. This will be a significant savings and will allow us to copy as many color copies as we need each month.

A suggestion was made that the Association might consider replacing the grass near lots 71, 72, 115, 201 and 202 to save water and be replaced with either crushed granite or astroturf. The Association is awaiting more information and input from the residents.
