MANAGER'S REPORT

Sparklight deals a lot with easements for public utilities. A lot of Villages residents have overbuilt the public utility easements. When that occurs and someone from public utilities , Sparklight, Lumen, APS, etc. need to repair or maintain those utilities, a utility company could require you to move your structure. If there is a fence on the easement, and it is in the way, the fence can be moved or destroyed and it is up to the homeowner to repair or replace the fence. Utility easements, especially communication pedestals, need to be accessible 24 hours per day 7 days per week. One Villages resident had planted a vine over it so that it was camouflaged and that is not allowed. One of the residents called Sparklight and stated they wanted Sparklight's stuff moved because they wanted to build a garage. The answer to the resident was that their equipment was in a public easement and they couldn't build a garage there. The easement exists to provide services to customers. There could be a time when they are trenching in new conduit and will have to get through yards. The easements in here are



Some homeowners likely mistakenly believe these standards are focused on finding violations or that they restrict their freedom of individual expression. Our HOA has an Architectural Review Committee as a vehicle to get questions answered before an owner spends money, allows owners to obtain recommendations before they build, and provides a reasonable framework from within each homeowner can express their individuality, tastes, and preferences without running afoul of the required rules and regulations. CONSUMER ALERT: Gift Card Purchases





Krts Mayes

At a glance:

Scammers use a variety of approaches to trick people into giving them money through the use of gift card purchases. Some examples are government impostor scams (fake IRS, fake jury duty, fake law enforcement); scams where the caller pretends to be a friend or family member; and utility company scams where a caller threatens to shut off utility services.

Scammers are requesting gift cards as a form of payment because it is difficult to track the scammer down once the gift card information is provided to the scammer.

Warning Signs:

- The caller may make the matter seem urgent and pressure you into buying a gift card to pay.
- The caller tries to convince you not to hang up and says that they will wait on the line for you to purchase the gift card and read them the activation number(s).
- The caller pretends to be from a government agency such as the IRS and claims that you are in trouble for failing to pay your taxes.
- The caller poses as a family member or friend with an emergency and in need of money.
- You are asked to purchase gift cards, send a money order, or wire funds to collect a prize.

Protect Yourself:

- Never pay for services or fees with a gift card.
- Don't be afraid to hang up on someone if you suspect they may be a scammer, especially if they are using high-pressure tactics.
- Be aware that scammers are able to "spoof" the phone number that they are calling from so that it looks like they are calling from a legitimate source.
- Legitimate government offices will not call and threaten you with imprisonment or demand that you pay a debt immediately.
- If you question the legitimacy of a call, contact the agency directly by using the information you find on the agency's website. DO NOT use numbers provided by the caller, as the numbers may be fake.
- If you encounter one of these scams, report it to the Arizona Attorney General's Office.




