MANAGER'S REPORT

Manager's Report

January 2023 - February 2023

Accomplishments:

FINANCE

I met with the Finance Committee to overview the financials.

I Created and received approval from the BOD for new Capitalization policy for the Policies and Procedures Manual

I have the financials ready for the CPA for Tax preparation

I met with the Executive Committee and the items discussed at the Executive committee have been added to this meeting agenda.

I held the Meet the Manager's meeting on Monday and the minutes have been sent via email to all residents. Please review the rules for compactor use

This compactor is only for the Villages at Lynx Creek Household trash bags, bagged leaves and minor landscape trimmings.

Prohibited items include but are not limited to any construction or remodel debris which includes but is not limited to building materials, packaging, rubble from remodeling and repair including sinks, cabinets, drywall, lumber, appliances, paint toilets. Also prohibited are unflattened boxes, furniture vehicle batteries, landscape debris over three feet in size or limbs that are larger than one to two inches.

Also, there is a misconception that if the person behind you at the compactor is your neighbor and know to you or the person has a badge, it is permissible for you to leave the compactor door open for the next resident.

Harry James goes to the dump on a regular basis and only asks you to contribute for the dump costs.

MAINTENANCE

For those of you who took the time to respond to the Villages Residents Facebook page on Jeanine's post of some of the things that he and Joe have been doing in the cooler months, Rich stated that anytime a resident wants to come down and look at what they are doing, he has an open book attitude.

The following is just a few projects that are on Rich's maintenance list thru April:

8-foot light poles and 20 feet. They are in the process of repairing or replacing lighting. Many of the poles have photo sensitive cells that need to be replaced.

Rich will spread red rock outside the social hall.

Gail and Rich are formulating a plan to trim more trees in the dog park.

Rich will be painting the planters inside the pool area and outside of the office.

Street signs and stop signs will be painted as needed.

Number signs on the south storage lot will be placed.

In March he will be draining the pool, cleaning and refilling it

VILLAGES UPCOMING ROAD PROJECT

As has been discussed at numerous HOA Meetings, we will be doing a major road / crack fill repair project here at The Villages.

Highlighted in YELLOW on the map below, are the streets that will have all the asphalt removed and then repaved. This project is scheduled to begin on March 27 and will take approximately 2 to 3 weeks depending upon weather. Once information is given to us by the vendor on when each street will be done and what will be required of the residents, that information will be forwarded to you.


Highlighted in GREEN on the map below, are the streets that will be treated for crack fill. This will NOT be a treatment where the entire streets are sealed as in the past, only the cracks will be treated. This project will only take a couple of days and residents will be informed when their street will be done and how long they need to stay off the street.

A project such as this is one of the largest projects a community like ours can have in cost, coordination, and community support.

This is not a Board or Office project, but one that will require all of us to follow direction and be patient in order to achieve a successful outcome.
