

## HELPFUL HINTS FROM "HANK AND HELOISE"



Hi everyone in the Villages,

We are so lucky to have our water bill paid for in our HOA fee. In fact, we never get an individual water bill. It is truly a perk of living here.

So many homes in the valley on city water usually have a meter in the yard that measures the amount of water being used. If it goes over a minimum amount, then the city utility bill for that home increases.

It is great that we do no have to worry about that.

Here is a hint. To keep our HOA fees from increasing because of the water use, keep a nozzle handy to put on the hose. When washing a vehicle, use the nozzle to temporarily turn off the water flow when soaping down and scrubbing the dirt off. The water will be handy but not flowing down the street and being wasted. Just turn the nozzle back on to rinse.




