MANAGER'S REPORT

The Meet the Manager's Meeting was held on December 11th in the Social Hall. Approximately 20 people were in attendance. The agenda was short as winter is upon us. Rich gave a maintenance report – the mail pedestals are done and the mailboxes will be cleaned and renumbered in January or February.

The Architectural Committee has been slow – not many rfc's during this winter time.

The changes preciously approved by the Board of the Recreation Committee were reviewed. One question was raised regarding wording in the Provisions on page 3 which states: "Admission must not be charged". I believe that this will be deleted as there was a change made in Policy 3.07 to address this. These rules will be reviewed and voted upon by the Executive Board of the Association at the February meeting.

The conversion of the property management software is progressing and the launch will be January 1. The office will be sending out notices to all residents and invites to create their own personal portal so that residents can view their invoices and payments online. Also, there will be no autopays (direct debits out of residents accounts) for the first few months to allow the office staff to work out the kinks prior to setting up any direct deductions from owners bank accounts. Those who pay by check or through their bank's automatic payment system will not be affected.

Jeanine's last day was December 15 and I wish to thank her for her always smiling countenance and her great training of Jan and Marty. I will miss her greatly! I know she is ready to retire and travel but she leaves a big hole.

Also, the best volunteer in the world is also retiring from helping in the office. I always joked that Joyce ran the place and we all just worked for her, but in a way it was true. She was so instrumental in writing the procedures for the front desk, helping me get to know the Villages and always such a positive presence in the office. I will miss her and her wise counsel and her great sense of humor.



TECHNOLOGY AND SENIORS



Title: Navigating the Digital World: A Guide to Cybersecurity for Seniors

Dear Seniors.

In this age of technological marvels and instant connectivity, the internet offers us a world of possibilities and lots of instant gratification to shop where we like, at any time day or night, and seems like it is easier than ever to get what we need, right? The Internet, however, also presents risks that we, as wise individuals, must navigate cautiously. Why? Because there are dangers that are not visible and many who seek to take our hard-earned money from us.

As told to me by Mike Smith recently, a neighbor of his experienced a cyber incident that serves as a valuable lesson for all of us, highlighting the importance of being vigilant while using social media, email, and the vast expanses of the World Wide Web. NOTE: this is NOT the only instance but serves as a good reminder of what to watch for.

This neighbor, engrossed in an online news article, encountered a seemingly harmless link that led him or her down a perilous path. Clicking on it, the individual was informed that the computer had been infected with a virus. The screen urged a call to a number for assistance. Despite previous warnings to never call any number that jumps on your screen, the number was dialed, and the bad guys instructed in an official tone to allow the individual to grant access to the laptop. The result? A fully compromised system with all files on it encrypted, a completely unusable hard drive, and the files were rendered permanently inaccessible.

Thankfully, local tech experts managed to intervene, utilizing a different operating system called Linux to access the computer and get the individual back to operation. Yet, this incident underscores the need for increased awareness and caution from all of us in the digital realm, especially for those who may not be as tech-savvy. Consider talking with your neighbors and friends about how to stay safe. Consider the value of your photos and other important documents that could be lost if such an occurrence happened to you.

Here are a few essential tips that Mike passed along to ensure your online experiences remain secure:

When in Doubt, **Shut it Down**: If you suspect any unusual activity or receive unexpected messages, shut down your device immediately. Taking this swift action can prevent further damage and give you time to assess the situation calmly.

Think Before You Click: Resist the temptation to click on unfamiliar links. If you're unsure about a link's legitimacy, hover your mouse over it to preview the destination URL. If it looks suspicious or doesn't match the expected website, refrain from clicking.

Question Everything: Not all information on the internet is accurate. Be discerning about the news, articles, and messages you encounter. If something seems too good to be true or sounds alarming, fact-check with reliable sources before taking any action.

Beware of Unsolicited Assistance: If a pop-up message or a phone call claims your computer has a problem, resist the urge to call the provided number. Legitimate tech support companies will never contact you without prior arrangement. Never grant remote access to your device unless you initiated the contact. When in doubt – call a neighbor or friend and don't use the computer you are working on to do so.

Remember, just like in the physical world, a healthy dose of skepticism can go a long way in safeguarding your digital life. Treat online threats like unwanted junk mail – discard them without hesitation. By following these simple guidelines, you can continue to spend enjoyable time on the internet while staying one step ahead of potential cyber threats.

January Murder Dinner Party


