2019 BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S ELECTION SCHEDULE

This year we have three (3) Directors to elect (for a two-year term)

Ballots are available for will-call at the front office (as of 5/31/19). In order to will-call your Ballot, *you must wear your Villages' name badge or provide your Driver's License to identify you as a Village's property owner.* The last day to will-call Ballots is Monday, June 10th.

June 11 Notice of the 2019 Annual Meeting and remaining Ballots will be mailed to Owners at their current address on file with FirstService Residential.

July 10 Annual Meeting & Election of Directors. The final deadline for returning ballots to the Villages' Office is July 10 at 11:00 AM. Ballots will be counted beginning 11:30 AM until completed by the Election Committee Ballot-Counting Team. The Annual Meeting will begin at 2:00 PM in the Social Hall. The election results will be announced at the meeting.

<u>Candidate Eligibility:</u> Per The Villages at Lynx Creek Owners Association By-Laws, Article VI, Section 2; To be eligible as a candidate, a person must be an Owner in good standing for not less than twelve (12) months immediately preceding the close of the application period and be in physical residence not less than six (6) months of the twelve (12) months preceding the close of the application period. Previous interrupted Ownership and/or residency or rental shall not apply toward this requirement.

CANDIDATE BIOGRAPHIES

DAVID CORTEZ

Sylvia and I have enjoyed living at the Villages since October 2003. We also reside in Surprise, AZ.

I worked for the City of San Diego for 10 years as a Financial Analyst and Efficiency Expert. Next 22 years was with San Diego Transit as Manager of Federal and State Grants, as well as Building Maintenance and in charge of major Capital projects.

I was honored to serve as Villages' HOA Vice President for 1 year and as President for 2 years. Also, I have served on Committees, including Capital Improvement and Fain project. In California, I was HOA President for 5 years.

My college degree is from San Diego State University in Business Management. Golfing is my main recreation. Last, but not least, I served in the U.S. Navy from March 1959 to March 1963.

CHUCK MERRITT

I have been a full-time homeowner in the Villages for two years.

As a graduate of the Management Center, Detroit, MI, I served in a Contracts Management position for Sam P. Wallace Co., Dallas, TX and Denver, CO, in their Denver office. My assignments included projects in Montana, Denver and Louisiana.

I was a construction manager for a mechanical firm before forming my own mechanical construction company, Merit Mechanical Industries, Inc.

I moved to Arizona and took the position of Director of the Yavapai Apache Indian Housing Authority, a HUD funded program for Native Americans. While working with HUD programs, I recognized a need for a qualified training consultant to serve the Native communities, so I formed my consulting company, IHA Management Systems, Inc., in 1993. In 1998, being recognized as one of the premier consultants for the Tribes, I was granted a nationwide 3-year grant to train and implement a new Congressional mortgage program for use on Tribal lands. I hired 5 additional consultants and we presented training seminars for investment bankers and Tribal administrators from Alaska to Florida.

I believe my management and housing experience would be a benefit for our Community. I have also worked with the Association of Builders & Contractors.

STEVE SERGI

I grew up in New Jersey; 6 great years in the U.S. Nuclear Submarine Service. I have been an owner/resident in the Villages since March 2013.

Worked for companies such as Digital Equipment Corp. in MA as Equipment Engineer Supervisor. After Digital, I worked for ATMI as an R&D Engineer in Danbury, Conn.

I have a solid background in electronic, electrical, and pneumatic/hydraulic systems; developed preventative maintenance procedures for semiconductor manufacturing and was a part of the development team for the Pentium Microprocessor.

SUPPLEMENTAL RULES for LEASING or RENTING PROPERTIES IN THE VILLAGES.

- Owners are required to follow these Rules when Renting or Leasing their Villages Property. See CC&R 1.22 which provides the authority for these rules.
- 2. Rental/Lease Agreements must Address Key Items such as:
 - a. Age requirements of the Tenants as this is an age restricted community.
 - b. That tenants must follow the rules of the Villages at Lynx Creek Owners Assoc. This includes CC&Rs, all controlling documents, and posted rules and regulations.
- 3. Owners must, immediately upon execution or the Lease/Rental Agreement, inform the office of the Lease/Rent Agreement, the start date and the names of the Tenant(s) and their phone number. Owner may provide a copy of the Lease/Rental Agreement containing this information to the office for inclusion in the owner's file for the Owner's and Association's reference.
- 4. Clearly spell out the penalty for failure to meet rental/lease obligations, including the Tenants obligation to obey and follow all Association rules.
- 5. Spell out as a term of the Lease/Rental agreement that *Tenants are required to register* with the office, complete the *Tenant Registration Form, provide all required information,* including emergency contacts, and obtain I.D. Badges. Failure of tenants to register will result in a Violation and potential subsequent Fine to the owner.
- 6. If it is an RV lot being rented or leased, follow the age and size limitations of RV's setting-up on a Villages' lot. Age of RVs is a maximum of 15 model years old and the RV size must allow it to fit within the set-backs on the lot. Allowing an older or oversized unit to set-up on a lot will result in a Violation and possible fine to the lot owner.

Owners failing to comply with these Lot/Home/Park Model Rental/Lease Rules or Whose Tenant(s) violate any Association Rule may receive a Violation, followed by a Fine if the violation is not resolved in the permitted time frame. Keep in mind, the owner(s) are responsible for the conduct of their Tenant(s) and may be required to pay fines levied as a result of their Tenant(s) actions.







"CREATING SAFER NEIGHBORHOODS ONE BLOCK AT A TIME"

Basic Fire Evacuation Procedures

In the event of a wildfire in Yavapai County, it may be necessary to evacuate residential areas to ensure the public's safety and facilitate responder access.

Evacuations are the responsibility of law enforcement, which includes the Yavapai County Sheriff Office (YCSO), Prescott Valley PD (PVPD), assisted by volunteers such as Yavapai Country Jeep Posse (YCJP) and Yavapai County Search and Rescue (YCSRT) units.

Evacuation warnings and instructions are broadcast by every means possible, including using public address systems, loud speakers, door to door, fire vehicles, radio, television and National Weather Service radio.

Communities are divided into manageable areas which will be assigned to teams from above agencies. They will notify residents of evacuation actions they should take, evacuation route and the shelter they need to report to. The actions may be notice of a pending evacuation, prepare to evacuate or evacuate immediately. Law enforcement will provide security for evacuated areas.

<u>The HOA Board and office personnel are not authorized or responsible for evacuation notices.</u>

They can send a robocall once notified by the above agencies

Once notified to evacuate, the notifying unit will attach orange tape somewhere visible on your property. If you must evacuate, you will be asked to hang a white cloth, such as a towel or tee shirt, etc., next to the orange tape. This will prevent the duplication of effort.

Departure from the area: Do not deviate from the route given; it will be the safest route and will allow access for emergency vehicles.

Registration: Everyone must proceed to the indicated registration area, whether you intend to stay there or not. This allows responders to know you have evacuated and enables the Red Cross to inform family and friends you are safe.

Re-entry: Is allowed as soon as safety permits, which may be delayed due to other dangers besides fire. Your safety far outweighs the inconvenience of being evacuated.

It is recommended you register all of your phones with YCSO Code Red program at www.ycsoaz.gov/. and with PVPD at https://local.nixles.com/register so you can receive alerts and notices from the YCSO and the PVPD and other local agencies.

A-C* NEWS FOR YOU: "Should Sycamore Trees be Banned?"

It has been requested that the A-C add the Sycamore tree to our "Forbidden Tree" list, due to allergies that some people may have to its pollen. So I did a little research on the matter, and briefly, here is what I found.

According to extensive scientific studies, the Sycamore trees' pollen is far less allergenic than most other trees (and MOST trees do provide some cause to be allergic). It is less of a threat allergy-wise than the Maple. In fact, most doctors seeking to discover what a person is allergic to don't even consider the Sycamore tree, until they have run out of probabilities. In reality, the Juniper and pine are far more dangerous regarding allergenic pollen than many other trees, including the Sycamore. This year has been a doozy of a year for Pine and Juniper pollen! Probably because of all the rain we had last winter.

However, since the Sycamore tree is a "water seeker" and is very messy, it *is* on the "banned tree" list. The last thing we need is more problems with our water and sewer systems. So, this tree has joined the other five (5) trees that are prohibited in our community.

While there have been several large trees cut down lately, they are being replaced with new, younger trees (as per the CC&Rs). Therefore, I thought it might be appropriate to remind you of which trees are *NOT* PERMITTED in our community.

According to the <u>"Architectural Rules and Regulations"</u> on page 8, "The following trees <u>are not permitted</u> in the Villages because of excessive leaf drop, size, water requirements and/or affinity for sewer lines: <u>Cottonwood</u>, <u>Willow, Maple, Raywood Ash, Sycamore</u>, and <u>Arizona Cyprus</u> (however, the Italian or Mediterranean or Leyland Cyprus are permitted)."

Also, please *Don't forget*: ALL outside projects <u>require an HOA permit</u> from the Architectural Committee BEFORE THE PROJECTS BEGIN. These yellow permits <u>need to be signed and returned</u> to our office when the project is finished. Your kind cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.
