A-C* NEWS FOR YOU: "<u>Is There A Purpose For</u> <u>The Architectural Committee</u>?"

From Rick and the *Architectural Committee

WHAT IS THE ARCHITECTRUAL COMMITTEE?

What is the purpose of our Architectural Committee? Are we arbiters over neighbor squabbles? Are we "Cops"? Do we go around looking for properties that are out of compliance with the CC&Rs? The answer is "NO!" to all of the above.

However, since we live in a pretty close community, and what we do with our own lots can, and often do, have an impact on our neighbors' lots. Sometimes that impact is positive, and, yes, sometimes it is negative. Therefore, the Architectural Committee *helps* to *prevent* squabbles by helping home-owners to improve their properties as they wish, <u>but in accordance with the CC&Rs</u>. In this way we help to preserve or even improve the property values of our homes and community. We also try to promote safety by looking for possible dangers in the plans that our property owners want to do.

WHO ARE THE MEMBERS?

The members of the Architectural Committee are all volunteers and fellow home owners here in the Villages. This Committee is an arm of the Villages' Board of Directors. As such, the Chairman of the Committee is a member of the Board of Directors. Our members currently are: Garth Jones, Chairman; Bill Johnson, Vice Chairman; and then, Sylvia Cortez, Carl Shulak, Nancy Larson, and Rick Merrell; and, Rob Sheaffer as Intern.

WHAT IS THE PROCESS?

In order to make improvements on the outside of your property, *there are four steps* that you need to follow: <u>First</u> submit a *Request For Change* (RFC) which you can pick up at the Office, or print from <u>The Villages' web page</u>. <u>Second</u>, Fill out the RFC and turn it in at the Office. <u>Third</u>, attend the Architectural Committee meeting (on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of the month at 9:30 a.m., in the Card Room) where the Committee may discuss, for clarity, your project. Upon approval you will be given the Villages' Permit (on Yellow paper). You are given 4 months to complete your project. <u>Fourth</u>, upon completion of your project <u>please sign the back of the Permit</u> and <u>turn it back in at the Office</u> so the Committee can complete your lot's file.


