**The Villages at Lynx Creek HA5 Project
FINAL PHASE OF ROAD PROJECT**

The project is scheduled as follows:

Tues, Sept 24th- Blue section with a 24 hour closure

Wed, Sept 25th- Red section with a 24 hour closure

Thurs, Sept 26th- Yellow section with a 24 hour closure

Fri, Sept 27th- Green section with a 24 hour closure

During the HA5 phase there will be a 24 hour road closure, and the roads and parking lot will not be available for travel or parking whatsoever. If the residents will need to use their vehicle during the 24 hour period of the road closure, they will need to plan ahead by parking their vehicle outside of the area designated as closed. All residents will receive a hand-delivered notification 2 to 3 days prior to the road work which affects their street.

DO YOU KNOW what the procedures are, as required by the CC&Rs, for making any improvements to the outside of your home or on your lot? Please remember to **FIRST** read the **CC&Rs** and the "**Architectural Committee Rules & Regulations.**" **THEN submit your plans on the HOA-required "Request For Change" (RFC), to the Architectural Committee (A-C), at the front office.**

DO YOU KNOW that this must be submitted BEFORE YOU START the actual work on your project. This includes painting and major repairs. **You may pick up an RFC at the Villages' office,** and turn it in there when the RFC is filled out. The A-C will go over it with you on the next meeting-day after you turn in the RFC.

DO YOU KNOW that it is **VERY IMPORTANT** that **YOU or your representative ATTEND THE A-C MEETING to discuss your plans with us, and to receive your HOA Permit.** The A-C meets every 1st and 3rd Wednesdays at 9 a.m, in the Card Room. Everyone is welcome – our meetings are open. If you have questions or just want to observe how the A-C works, you are welcome.

“CREATING SAFER NEIGHBORHOODS ONE BLOCK AT A TIME”

Block Watch Keys for Safety and Security

Successful criminals look for easy, profitable targets. They do not want to enter facilities that are well lighted and difficult to access and egress.

Following are basic keys that will help achieve some measure of safety and security:

- Tell a neighbor or friend when you are going to be away for any length of time.
- Know your neighbors well enough so you can determine what kind of activities are not normal and suspicious in nature, particularly, if they are away.
- Remove targets of opportunity. Keep doors and sheds locked. Keep valuable items out of sight or locked up. **Use common sense and don't advertise your absence.**
- Lock your vehicles when unattended or unoccupied and in open areas or carports and don't leave valuables in sight.
- Don't leave your garage doors open during the day when you're not there. Thieves will drive by, note if there is anything of value, come back at an opportune time and within seconds grab and run.
- **DO NOT CONFRONT** suspicious persons or activities. Report any suspicious person/s or activity to the **Prescott Valley Police** immediately.
If you see something, say something!
REMEMBER: Call 911 for **emergencies only**. Call **928-772-9261** for suspicious and any other non-emergency or non-life threatening situations.

LIGHTS! LIGHTS! LIGHTS! Criminals don't like lights or noises. Make it difficult for criminals to enter property and homes. Install motion sensor lights around critical areas your home. Place lights high enough to be out of the reach of criminals.
