ROAD REMOVAL AND REPLACEMENT

After months of planning and deliberation our project is near completion. There are two areas we have identified that the contractor has been notified will need additional work, (the intersection of Travertine and Ponderosa Pine and the intersection of Ponderosa Pine and Mesquite Tree), but the remaining roads are complete.

This includes crack filling of all roads that were not replaced which should assist in delaying future replacement. In addition to the road replacement and crack fill; we received at no cost to us, the use of the asphalt millings to fill the South and North RV lots, the Community gravel parking <u>lot</u> and our maintenance yard.

The total project cost was \$351,687, (budget \$350,000).

On behalf of the Board, we would like to thank the office and maintenance staff and our residents for your assistance and patience throughout the project.

#### 2023 BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTION SCHEDULE

- April 3 Candidate Applications will be available at the HOA office. If you would like an application to be emailed to you, please contact Jeanine or Gail at 928-772-7047. (See below for Candidate Eligibility.)
- May 12 Deadline (Close of the Application Period) to return completed Candidate
  Applications to the HOA office, and given to a member of the office staff during their normal
  business hours. Eligible candidate names and resumes will be published in the June Crier.
- June 12 The Nominating Committee will host a "Meet the Candidates" forum, so that residents may ask questions directly to the candidates. This will follow the Manager's meeting.
- June 1-13 Voting ballots are available at the HOA office during regular business hours for owners to pick up in person. You must wear your card key or show other identification indicating your lot number only one ballot per lot. You may not obtain the ballot for any other homeowner. Please read and follow the instructions included with your ballot, so that your ballot will not be disqualified. After completing your ballot, you may return it to the HOA office in person or send it via regular mail. We urge you to pick up your ballot and return it in person, in order to save on mailing expense, and also to assure that it is received by the deadline.
- June 13 The notice of the 2023 Annual Meeting and any remaining ballots not picked up in person will be mailed out to owners at their address of record. Make sure that our HOA records include your correct mailing address for you to receive your ballot timely.
- June 15 Monthly HOA meeting. Candidates available for possible questions..
- July 12 The Annual Meeting will begin at 2:00 p.m. Ballots received at the HOA office on or before 11:00 a.m. will be counted beginning at 11:30 a.m. until completed by the ballot-counting team of volunteers. Meeting attendees will have an opportunity to submit their ballot, if they have not already done so. The results of the election will be announced at this meeting.
- CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY Per The Villages at Lynx Creek Owners Association Bylaws, Article VI, Section 2: "To be eligible as a candidate, a person must be an Owner in good standing for not less than twelve (12) months immediately preceding the close of the application period and be in physical residence not less than six (6) of the twelve (12) months preceding the close of the application period. Previous interrupted Ownership and/or residency or rental shall not apply toward this requirement."

The phrase "in good standing" means that the owner is not more than thirty days in arrears in their monthly assessment and has not had their HOA membership suspended.

#### **MANAGER'S REPORT**

Monday, April, 2023

Road Repair update – All of the roads but two are replaced or repaired as of this report. I want to give a big, big thank you to Bob for all of his volunteered time over the last six months in research and negotiation with the Paving Contractors. I also want to thank Rich for supporting Bob on the road project.

The Nominating Committee for the three upcoming open Board positions are Bonnie Fay, Liz Brooks and Chair Al Myers.

The chain is now installed on Mountain Brush Drive. This chain is to discourage non-residents from driving through the private streets of the Villages. Locking Gate for Mountain Brush:

#### Maintenance Report:

Pool was emptied, acid washed, cleaned and refilled. The robo (automatic pool cleaner motor is not working. Rich is working with the supplier; the motor is on national back order and we are no. 18 out of 25 backorders for our pool supplier. Rich is working diligently to either get the motor or finding another solution. A new robo would cost approximately \$5,000.00. The pool is scheduled to open at the end of April.

The pool deck cracks have been repaired

Planters have been painted. Dead plants have been replaced under warranty.

Concrete is scheduled to be poured poolside.

20-foot pole lights have been replaced or repaired. Joe is waiting for a couple of photo cell replacements Gutters will be re-secured.

There will no longer be access to the Maintenance Yard.

Compactor - reminder that branches no bigger than 2 inches in diameter and no longer than 3 feet.

If you have non compactor items, please take to the dump or wait for the roll off we bring in for the Patio Sales.

The Town of Prescott Valley will have a free cleanup day (see Flyer)

Moving the Water Machine next to the Soda Machine in the Common Area-still on plan.

Mailbox posts replacement is schedule for May or June.

<u>Crier will not be available until first of month</u>: This is because the company that owns the lease on our copier has limited the number of color prints we can make without being charged for each page (7 cents per page x 38 pgs = 2.66 per Crier) So we have to ration the number of copies we make and that means we use up the allotment at the beginning of the month.

After the last electrical outage when we were afraid that it was one of our transformers that had died, the Board asked me to find someone who would be able to advise us on the cost of replacing a transformer if one should break or would fail

#### **MAYOR'S VISIT RECAP**

The mayor of Prescott Valley, Kell Palguta, took center stage at an April 12<sup>th</sup> town hall meeting to inform the residents of the Villages about plans for the long-term future and some that are already underway.

Joined by Assistant Town Manager, Cutter Chamberlain, the pair answered questions from the residents who gathered to gain clarity between rumors and facts. Mayor Palguta answered specific questions about the intersection at Village Blvd and 69, additional new road construction, housing, and concerns about water supplies. The mayor explained that Prescott Valley planners are ahead of the curve for what is to come and that they are ready for what lies ahead. Mayor Palguta stated that the property in front of the Villages is to remain commercial zoning. The housing project "went away" when the Prescott Valley council declined the requested zoning change.

Chamberlain touted the free downloadable phone app "OurPV" for residents using Apple or Android devices.
